HIGHWAY FUNDING 1994 - 1997

Date

Total disbursements for highways are expected to exceed \$100 billion in 1997, an increase of \$10 billion or 11 percent over 1994. This is the first time that the \$100 billion threshold has been reached and represents a doubling in highway spending in only 13 years. In 1984, total highway spending first reached \$50 billion a year. Total revenues used for highways or placed in reserves for highways are expected to reach \$101.8 billion in 1997. While reserves at the Federal level are expected to increase by \$2.7 billion, the States are expected to draw some \$1.1 billion from reserves in 1997.

Total highway-user revenues of \$89.4 billion (motor fuel, motor vehicle taxes and fees and tolls) are anticipated in 1997 which would fund over 89 percent of all highway disbursements in 1997. However, \$17.1 billion of highway-user revenues are destined for collection expenses, general government expenses, and other nonhighway uses while \$7 billion will be used for mass transportation. Consequently, only 73 percent of taxes and fees charged to road users will be applied to the highway programs of Federal, State and local governments. Since over one-fourth of highway-user revenues will be expended for nonhighway purposes, governments at all levels must apply a variety of non-user revenues for highway purposes. Non-user revenue sources include general funds, other specific taxes and fees dedicated to highway purposes, investment income and bond proceeds.

Revenues to the Highway Account of the Federal Highway Trust Fund should total nearly \$22 billion in FY 1997. This is about the same as in FY 1996 and represents an increase when compared to the \$18.8 billion in FY 1995, and \$16.2 billion in FY 1994.

Effective October 1, 1995, the Highway Account of the Federal Highway Trust Fund received the proceeds from an additional 2 cents tax per gallon of motor fuel that had previously been dedicated to deficit reduction. Beginning in 1994, the Highway Account also benefitted from an increased level of diesel fuel tax collections. This influx of new revenue is expected to cause the balance of the Highway Account to grow from \$9.4 billion in 1995 to \$14.8 billion in 1997.

The increase in Federal diesel fuel tax collections can largely be attributed to the change in the point of taxation from the wholesale to the terminal level and the IRS diesel fuel dyeing program that went into effect in January 1, 1994. This program and related joint Federal/State enforcement efforts have significantly reduced Federal and State fuel tax evasion, generating additional revenues for both the Federal Highway Trust Fund, and for State highway programs. Both the Federal and State governments are expected to continue to benefit from this increased tax compliance in FY 1997 and in the future. Capital expenditures are expected to rise to \$46.6 billion in 1997, accounting for over 46 percent of total highway expenditures. This is an increase of \$4 billion, or 10 percent, compared to 1994. State governments will be responsible for approximately 76 percent of the total, with capital expenditures of \$35.2 billion.

Based upon the latest available data, 31 percent of the State government capital expenditures will be for projects on the Interstate system, and 38 percent will be used on other principal arterials. An additional 22 percent will be for projects on other arterial and collectors, while 9 percent will be used for local roads. Of the amount expended by States on arterial and collectors, 19 percent is expected to be used for new roads and bridges, 31 percent for other capacity improvements, 44 percent for system preservation, and 6 percent for operational and safety-related improvements.

Total funding for highways including receipts, intergovernmental payments, and disbursements for the years 1994 through 1997 are shown in the attached Table HF-10B.

Projected highway expenditures for 1997 are summarized as follows:
