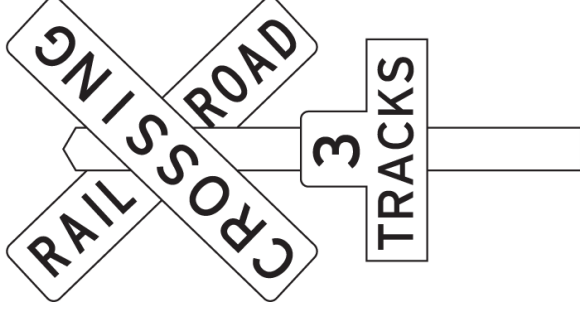

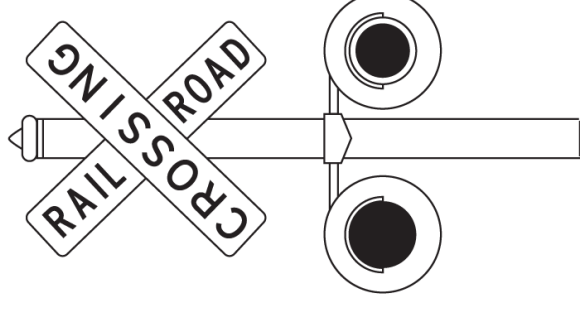
# What do the signs mean?



The advance warning sign tells you that a railroad crosses at the road ahead. Watch and listen for trains and be prepared to stop.



A crossbuck sign marks the place where a road crosses a railroad track. This sign tells you to look and listen for a train. If a train is coming, you must stop and let the train go by before crossing the tracks.



Some railroad crossings have lights that flash. Others have flashing lights with a gate that lowers across the road. When the lights are flashing, a train is coming. STOP. NEVER ignore a flashing light or go around a lowered gate.



**Fun Fact: A 100-car train takes over a mile to stop. To be safe, stay far away from trains and off the tracks. YOU can stop quickly, but a TRAIN cannot.**

# Locomotive

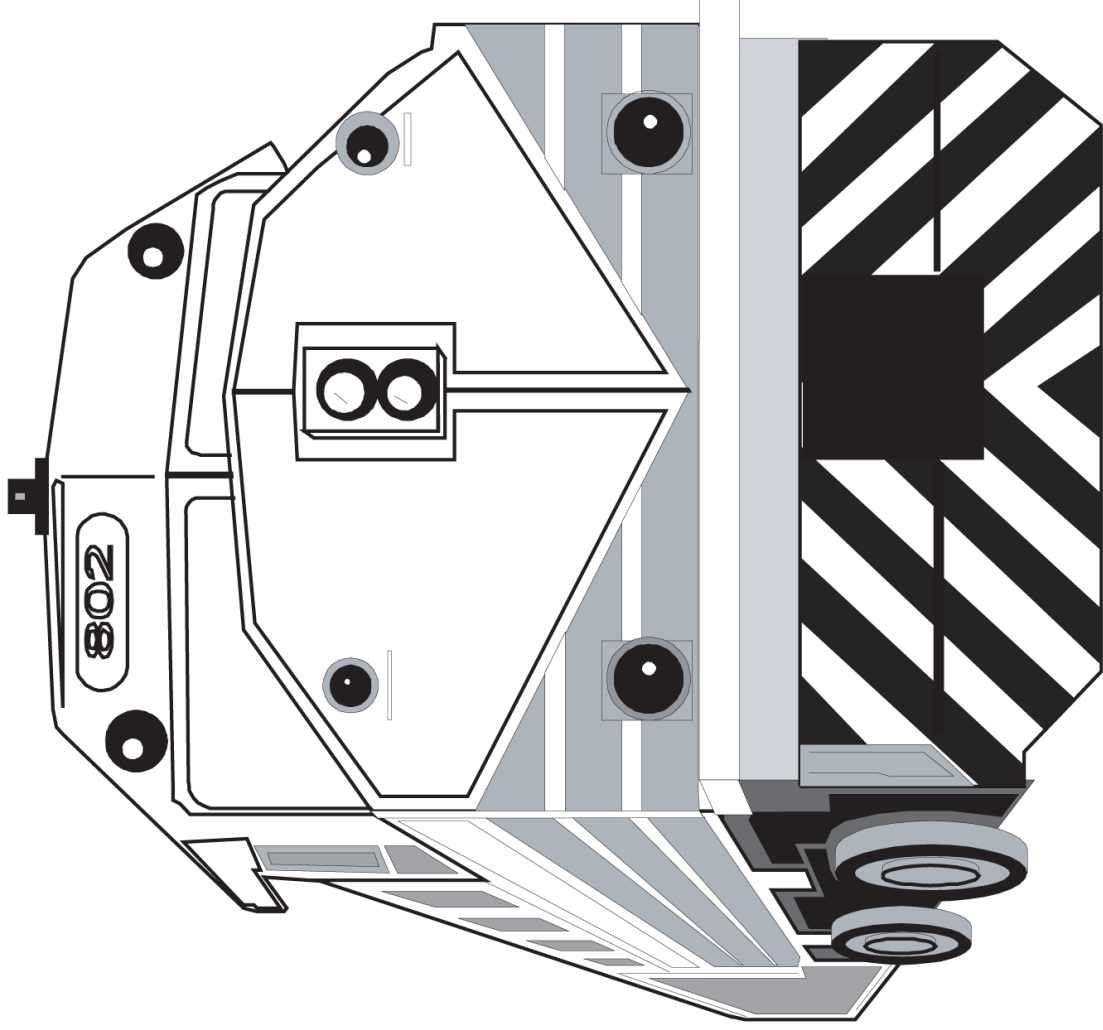
The locomotive provides the power to pull the train cars. The engineer drives the locomotive.

The engineer worries when people are on or near the tracks because he knows that trains are big and fast and can't stop easily.

Can you draw the engineer driving the locomotive?



**A longer train may have more than one locomotive to provide enough power to pull all the train cars. Sometimes you will even see locomotives at the end of a train, to help “push” the rail cars down the track.**

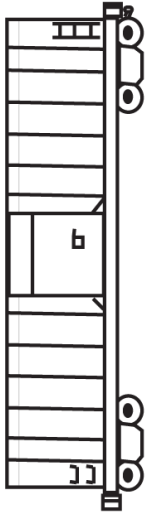

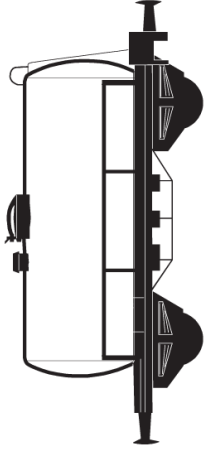

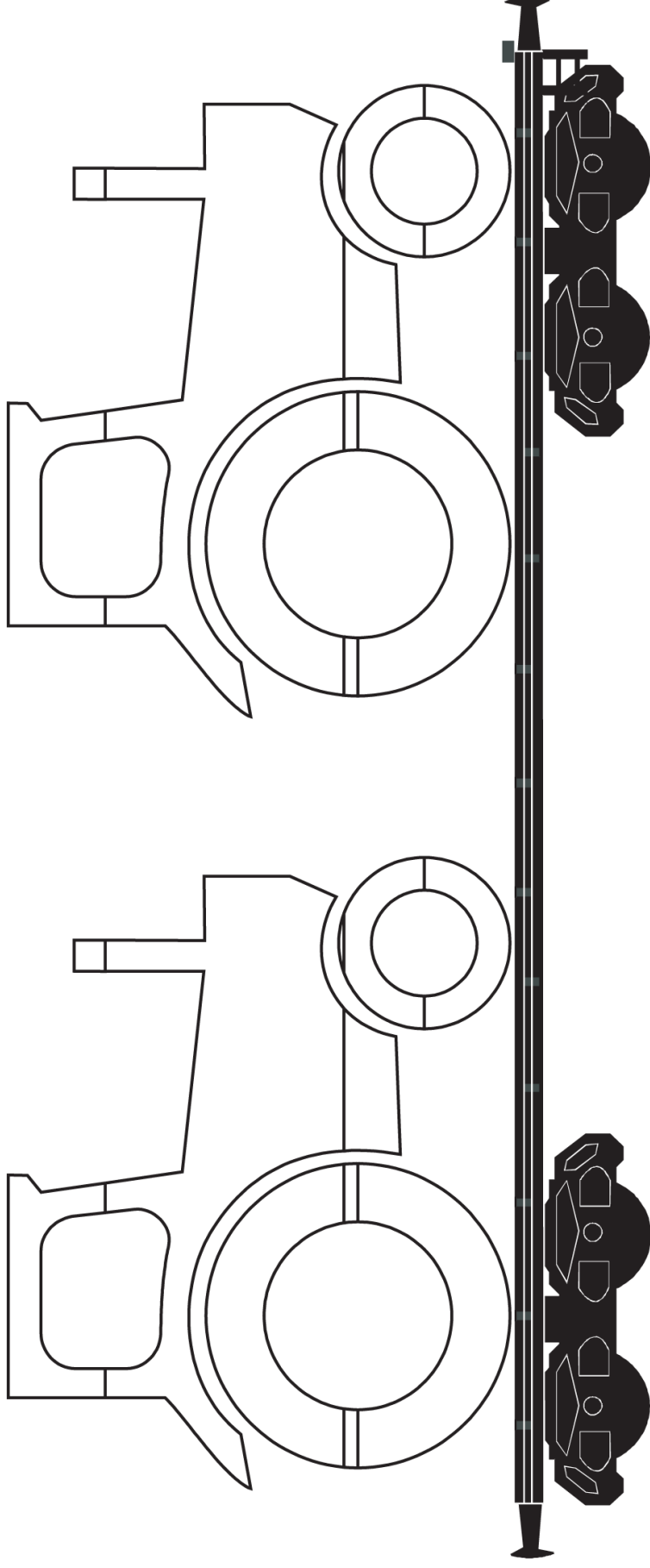

**Answer:** Tractors

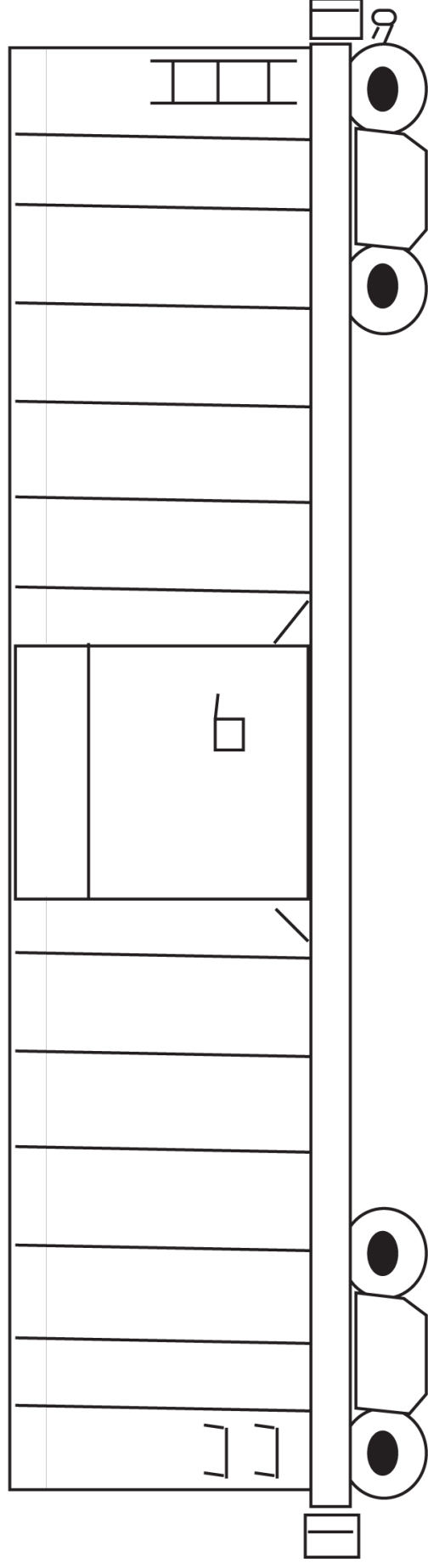
# Iowa Railroad Word Find

# This is a box car. Box cars carry many things like food, toys and clothing.

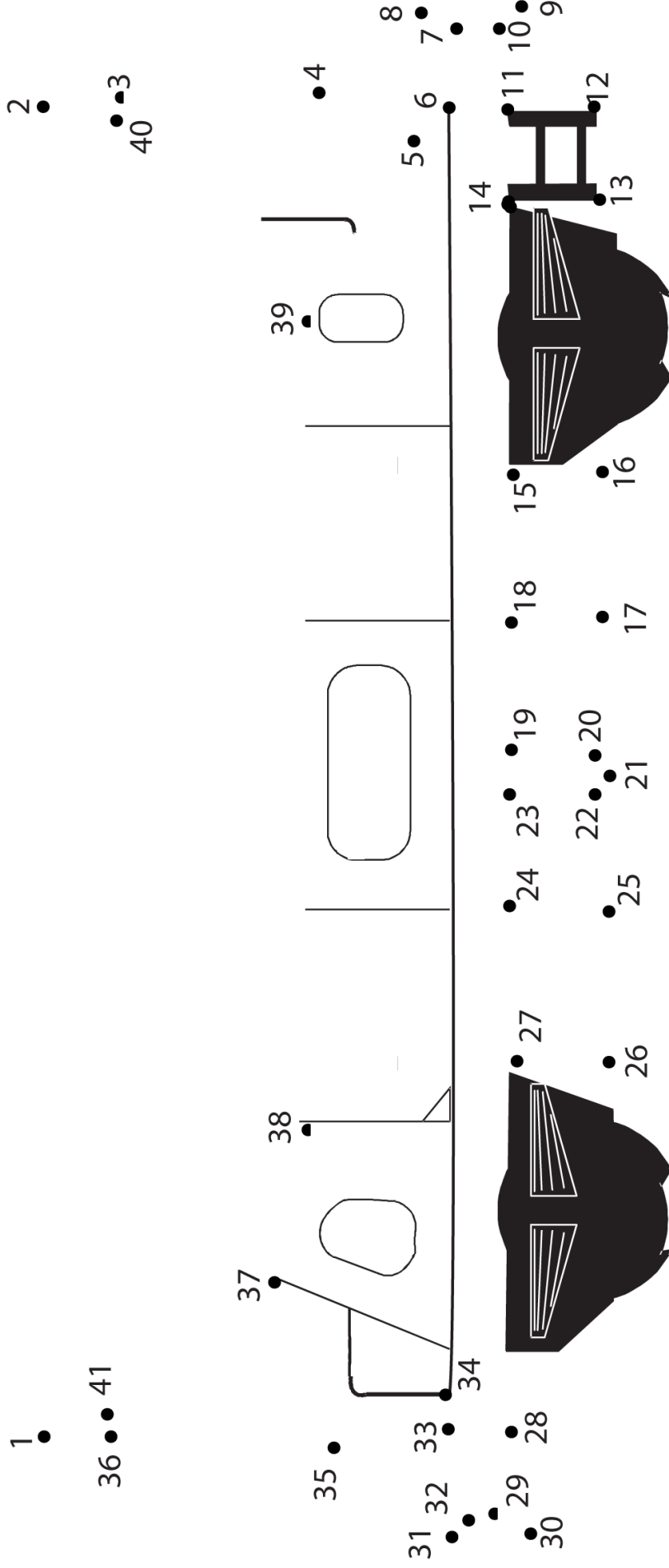
Can you fill the box car by drawing your favorite toys?



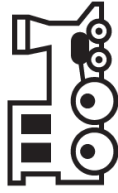
**Fun Fact:** Refrigerated box cars are used to ship fruits, vegetables and frozen foods over a long distance without spoiling.

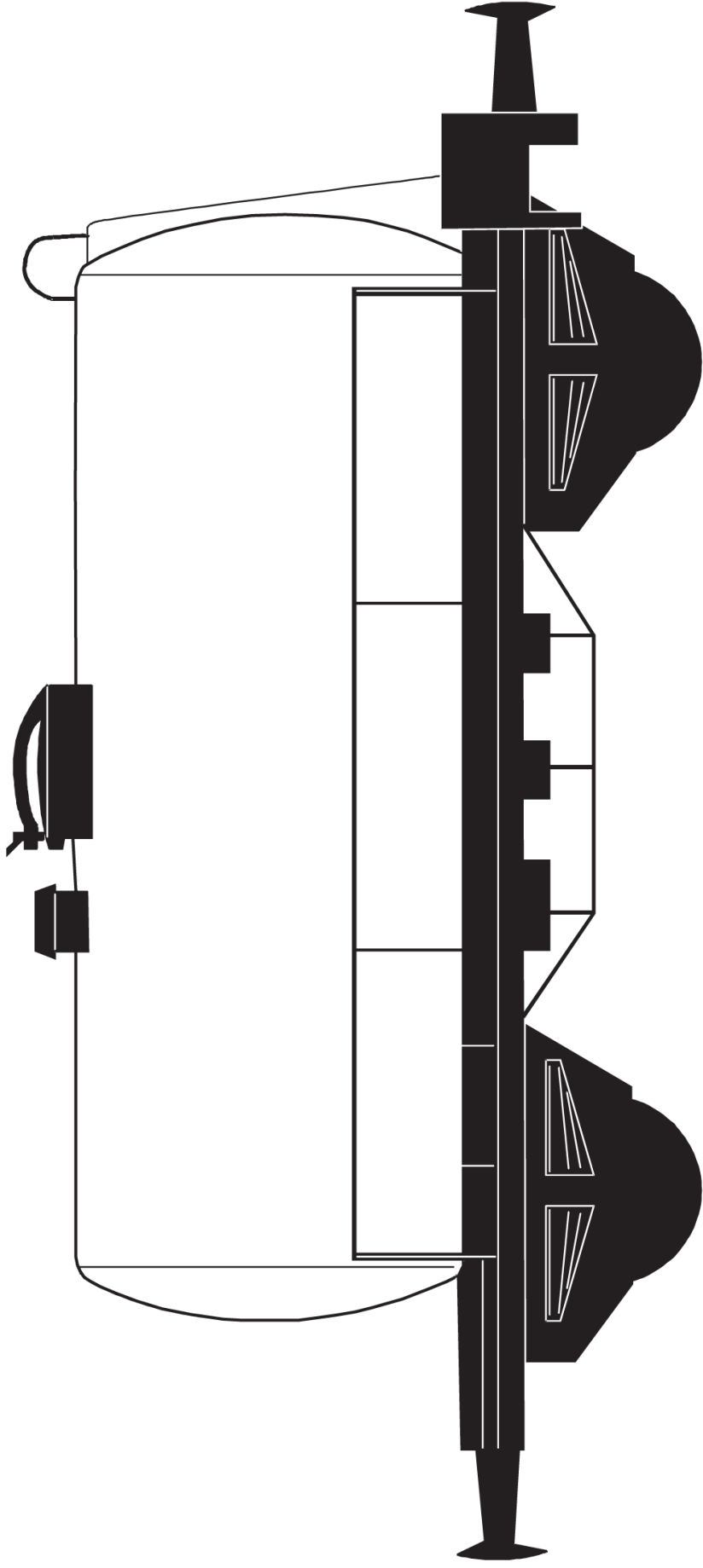

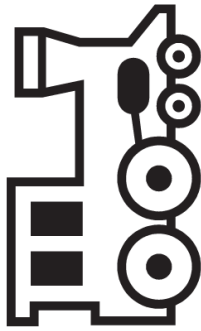
# This railroad car is used to haul liquids.

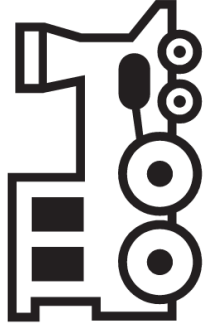

# Be Smart, Be Safe, Stay Alive

## AT A CROSSING

Freight trains can come at any time of the day or night, so always look and listen before crossing.

Cross only at marked crossings.

Don't take a shortcut. Walk a little farther and cross at the road crossing.

STOP when the lights are flashing and the gate arm is down.

NEVER go around a gate that is down.

Don't EVER try to beat a train at a crossing. If you are wrong, you will lose.

Listen for warning bells and whistles. Turn off loud music and remove head phones.

Don't stand too close to the tracks.

Look and listen AGAIN before crossing. If one train passes, make sure another one is not coming.

## AROUND RAILROAD TRACKS AND TRAINS

Never walk or play on or near railroad tracks.

Never walk out on a railroad bridge or enter a tunnel. You may not be able to get out of the way if a train comes.

Don't trespass on rail property-the tracks and nearby area are the private property of the railroad. Trespassing is illegal.

Don't climb on or crawl under a train.

Don't walk or ride your bike between the cars of a stopped train.

Don't ever try to jump inside a box car.

Don't play inside a rail car.

Don't put coins or other objects on the tracks. You could get hurt or cause a wreck.
