

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Alabama

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 72 percent of the households in Alabama took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Alabama households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Alabama took 17.5 million person-trips, an average of 5.0 trips and 2,917 miles per traveler. Visitors to Alabama took 16.8 million person-trips, an average of 5.3 trips and 3,285 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Alabama has grown 29 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 36 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Alabama take 4.7 car trips per traveler compared with 2.0 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are flown by air (4,080 miles) than by car (2,346 miles).
- Travelers from Alabama who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.6 trips per traveler compared with 6.2 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Alabama are Georgia, Florida and Tennessee. Georgia, Florida and Tennessee also are the most popular origin states for travelers to Alabama.

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Alaska

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 92 percent of the households in Alaska took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Alaska households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Alaska took 2.5 million person-trips, an average of 3.9 trips and 6,949 miles per traveler. Visitors to Alaska took 3.0 million person-trips, an average of 4.6 trips and 14,001 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Alaska has grown 48 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 57 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Alaska take 3.3 car trips per traveler compared with 2.4 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are flown by air (7,506 miles) than by car (1,901 miles).
- Travelers from Alaska who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.6 trips per traveler compared with 4.2 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Alaska are Texas, Washington, and California. Washington, California and Oregon are the most popular origin states for travelers to Alaska.





Arizona

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 89 percent of the households in Arizona took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Arizona households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Arizona took 20.5 million person-trips, an average of 4.7 trips and 4,209 miles per traveler. Visitors to Arizona took 21.3 million person-trips, an average of 5.0 trips and 5,392 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Arizona has grown 39 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 20 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Arizona take 4.2 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are flown by air (4,721 miles) than by car (2,310 miles).
- Travelers from Arizona who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.0 trips per traveler compared with 5.0 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Arizona are California, Nevada, and Texas. California, New Mexico, and Texas are the most popular origin states for travelers to Arizona.

Arkansas

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 76 percent of the households in Arkansas took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Arkansas households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Arkansas took 10.5 million person-trips, an average of 5.2 trips and 3,424 miles per traveler. Visitors to Arkansas took 10.3 million person-trips, an average of 5.3 trips and 3,351 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Arkansas has grown 51 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 40 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Arkansas take 4.7 car trips per traveler compared with 2.0 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are flown by air (3,735 miles) than by car (2,649 miles).
- Travelers from Arkansas who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.7 trips per traveler compared with 6.7 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Arkansas are Texas, Missouri, and Oklahoma. Texas, Missouri and Tennessee are the most popular origin states for travelers to Arkansas.





STATE HIGHLIGHTS

California

- People who live in California take 3.5 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are flown by air (5,598 miles) than by car (1,961 miles).
- Travelers from California who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.2 trips per traveler compared with 4.7 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in California are Nevada, Arizona, and Hawaii. Arizona, Nevada and Washington are the most popular origin states for travelers to California.





- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Colorado are California, New Mexico, Wyoming. California, Texas and Kansas are the most popular origin states for travelers to Colorado..

- People who live in Connecticut take 3.7 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,484 miles) than by car (1,840 miles).
- Travelers from Connecticut who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.4 trips per traveler compared with 5.0 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Connecticut are Massachusetts, New York, and Pennsylvania. Massachusetts, New York, and New Jersey are the most popular origin states for travelers to Connecticut.









STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Hawaii

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 75 percent of the households in Hawaii took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Hawaii households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Hawaii took 2.3 million person-trips, an average of 2.7 trips and 7,392 miles per traveler. Visitors to Hawaii took 4.6 million person-trips, an average of 3.4 trips and 16,538 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Hawaii has increased 62 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 13 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Hawaii take 2.8 car trips per traveler compared with 2.7 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (7,155 miles) than by car (924 miles).
- Travelers from Hawaii who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.1 trips per traveler compared with 3.0 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Hawaii are Nevada, California, and Washington. California, Washington, and Texas are the most popular origin states for travelers to Hawaii.




STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Idaho

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 89 percent of the households in Idaho took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Idaho households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Idaho took 7.0 million person-trips, an average of 5.5 trips and 3,949 miles per traveler. Visitors to Idaho took 6.8 million person-trips, an average of 5.9 trips and 4,554 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Idaho has increased 36 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 44 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 17 percent and the number of miles has increased 28 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Idaho take 5.0 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,218 miles) than by car (2,816 miles).
- Travelers from Idaho who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.0 trips per traveler compared with 6.6 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Idaho are Utah, Washington, and Oregon. Utah, Washington, and Oregon also are the most popular origin states for travelers to Idaho.

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Illinois

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 78 percent of the households in Illinois took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Illinois households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Illinois took 41.7 million person-trips, an average of 4.0 trips and 3,658 miles per traveler. Visitors to Illinois took 33.1 million person-trips, an average of 5.0 trips and 3,621 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Illinois has increased 16 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 21 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Illinois take 3.6 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,037 miles) than by car (2,197 miles).
- Travelers from Illinois who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.8 trips per traveler compared with 4.1 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Illinois are Wisconsin, Missouri, and Indiana. Michigan, Wisconsin, and Indiana are the most popular origin states for travelers to Illinois.

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Indiana

- People who live in Indiana take 4.0 car trips per traveler compared with 1.9 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,517 miles) than by car (2,113 miles).
- Travelers from Indiana who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.0 trips per traveler compared with 5.4 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Indiana are Illinois, Michigan, and Ohio. Illinois, Ohio, and Kentucky are the most popular origin states for travelers to Indiana.

- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Kansas are Missouri, Oklahoma, and Colorado. Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas are the most popular origin states for travelers to Kansas.

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Kentucky

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 73 percent of the households in Kentucky took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Kentucky households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Kentucky took 15.9 million person-trips, an average of 4.9 trips and 2,993 miles per traveler. Visitors to Kentucky took 14.1 million person-trips, an average of 5.3 trips and 2,891 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Kentucky has increased 66 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 68 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Kentucky take 4.6 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,690 miles) than by car (2,284 miles).
- Travelers from Kentucky who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.9 trips per traveler compared with 5.9 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Kentucky are Tennessee, Ohio, and Indiana. Ohio, Indiana, and Tennessee are the most popular origin states for travelers to Kentucky.





- People who live in Louisiana take 4.1 car trips per traveler compared with 2.0 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,965 miles) than by car (2,345 miles).
- Travelers from Louisiana who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.1 trips per traveler compared with 5.6 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Louisiana are Texas, Mississippi, and Florida. Texas, Mississippi, and Florida also are the most popular origin states for travelers to Louisiana.

- Travelers who live in Maine took 5.3 million person-trips, an average of 4.6 trips and 3,186 miles per traveler. Visitors to Maine took 9.2 million person-trips, an average of 4.7 trips and 3,600 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Maine has increased 42 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 54 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Maine take 4.4 car trips per traveler compared with 1.8 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,264 miles) than by car (2,122 miles).
- Travelers from Maine who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.7 trips per traveler compared with 5.4 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Maine are Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and New York. Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New Hampshire are the most popular origin states for travelers to Maine.





STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Maryland

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 83 percent of the households in Maryland took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Maryland households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Maryland took 21.4 million person-trips, an average of 4.4 trips and 3,158 miles per traveler. Visitors to Maryland took 12.9 million person-trips, an average of 4.1 trips and 2,529 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Maryland has increased 11 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 20 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Maryland take 3.9 car trips per traveler compared with 2.0 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,942 miles) than by car (1,952 miles).
- Travelers from Maryland who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.9 trips per traveler compared with 4.5 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Maryland are Virginia, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey. Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York are the most popular origin states for travelers to Maryland.





- During 1995, about 76 percent of the households in Massachusetts took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Massachusetts households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Massachusetts took 20.6 million person-trips, an average of 4.2 trips and 3,609 miles per traveler. Visitors to Massachusetts took 16.6 million person-trips, an average of 5.2 trips and 4,456 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Massachusetts has increased 24 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 20 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Massachusetts take 3.7 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,249 miles) than by car (1,816 miles).
- Travelers from Massachusetts who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.7 trips per traveler compared with 4.7 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Massachusetts are New Hampshire, Maine, and New York. New York, Connecticut and Maine are the most popular origin states for travelers to Massachusetts.





- During 1995, about 82 percent of the households in Michigan took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Michigan households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Michigan took 42.0 million person-trips, an average of 5.0 trips and 3,864 miles per traveler. Visitors to Michigan took 34.5 million person-trips, an average of 5.0 trips and 3,198 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Michigan has remained the same since 1977, but the number of miles per visitor has increased 14 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Michigan take 4.5 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,982 miles) than by car (2,600 miles).
- Travelers from Michigan who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.4 trips per traveler compared with 5.7 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Michigan are Ohio, Illinois, and Florida. Indiana, Illinois, and Ohio are the most popular origin states for travelers to Michigan.






STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Minnesota

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 85 percent of the households in Minnesota took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Minnesota households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Minnesota took 26.6 million person-trips, an average of 5.6 trips and 3,989 miles per traveler. Visitors to Minnesota took 24.8 million person-trips, an average of 5.5 trips and 3,429 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Minnesota has decreased 5 percent since 1977, but the number of miles per visitor has remained the same. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Minnesota take 5.2 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,568 miles) than by car (2,649 miles).
- Travelers from Minnesota who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.7 trips per traveler compared with 6.0 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Minnesota are Wisconsin, North Dakota, and Iowa. Wisconsin, Iowa, and North Dakota are the most popular origin states for travelers to Minnesota.

- People who live in Mississippi take 4.9 car trips per traveler compared with 2.1 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,374 miles) than by car (2,454 miles).
- Travelers from Mississippi who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.7 trips per traveler compared with 6.9 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Mississippi are Louisiana, Tennessee, and Alabama. Louisiana, Florida, and Tennessee are the most popular origin states for travelers to Mississippi.

- The number of trips per visitor to Missouri has increased 26 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 44 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Missouri take 4.9 car trips per traveler compared with 2.4 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,148 miles) than by car (2,698 miles).
- Travelers from Missouri who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.0 trips per traveler compared with 6.2 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Missouri are Illinois, Kansas and Oklahoma. Illinois, Kansas, and Texas are the most popular origin states for travelers to Missouri.

- The number of trips per visitor to Montana has increased 69 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 100 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Montana take 5.8 car trips per traveler compared with 1.8 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,500 miles) than by car (3,464 miles).
- Travelers from Montana who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.6 trips per traveler compared with 7.0 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Montana are Washington, Idaho, and Wyoming. Wyoming, California, and Washington are the most popular origin states for travelers to Montana.





- People who live in Nebraska take 4.8 car trips per traveler compared with 1.8 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,953 miles) than by car (2,890 miles).
- Travelers from Nebraska who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.3 trips per traveler compared with 6.0 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Nebraska are Iowa, Colorado and Missouri. Kansas, Iowa and Colorado are the most popular origin states for travelers to Nebraska.





- People who live in Nevada take 4.1 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,330 miles) than by car (2,785 miles).
- Travelers from Nevada who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.5 trips per traveler compared with 5.9 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Nevada are California, Utah and Arizona. California, Utah and Arizona also are the most popular origin states for travelers to Nevada.

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

New Hampshire

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 80 percent of the households in New Hampshire took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. New Hampshire households travel the same as the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in New Hampshire took 5.1 million person-trips, an average of 5.0 trips and 3,703 miles per traveler. Visitors to New Hampshire took 6.9 million person-trips, an average of 5.1 trips and 2,596 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to New Hampshire has increased 28 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 33 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in New Hampshire take 4.6 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,782 miles) than by car (2,149 miles).
- Travelers from New Hampshire who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.3 trips per traveler compared with 5.8 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in New Hampshire are Massachusetts, Maine and Connecticut. Massachusetts, Connecticut and Maine are the most popular origin states for travelers to New Hampshire.





- The number of trips per visitor to New Jersey has increased 13 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 12 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in New Jersey take 3.4 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,228 miles) than by car (1,769 miles).
- Travelers from New Jersey who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.1 trips per traveler compared with 4.4 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in New Jersey are Pennsylvania, New York and Florida. Pennsylvania, Maryland and New York are the most popular origin states for travelers to New Jersey.






- The number of trips per visitor to New Mexico has increased 94 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 137 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in New Mexico take 5.5 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,167 miles) than by car (3,087 miles).
- Travelers from New Mexico who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 5.2 trips per traveler compared with 6.8 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in New Mexico are Texas, Arizona and Colorado. Texas, Colorado and California are the most popular origin states for travelers to New Mexico.

- Travelers who live in New York took 50.4 million person-trips, an average of 3.7 trips and 3,389 miles per traveler. Visitors to New York took 40.8 million person-trips, an average of 4.6 trips and 3,974 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to New York has grown 2 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 43 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in New York take 3.3 car trips per traveler compared with 1.9 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,359 miles) than by car (1,919 miles).
- Travelers from New York who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.4 trips per traveler compared with 4.3 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in New York are Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, and Florida. Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Massachusetts are the most popular origin states for travelers to New York.




- The number of trips per visitor to North Carolina has increased 10 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 42 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in North Carolina take 4.4 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,938 miles) than by car (2,317 miles).
- Travelers from North Carolina who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.0 trips per traveler compared with 6.2 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in North Carolina are South Carolina, Virginia and Georgia. Virginia, Florida and Georgia are the most popular origin states for travelers to North Carolina.





- The number of trips per visitor to North Dakota has increased 21 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has increased 16 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in North Dakota take 5.6 car trips per traveler compared with 1.7 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,763 miles) than by car (2,892 miles).
- Travelers from North Dakota who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.6 trips per traveler compared with 7.4 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in North Dakota are Minnesota, South Dakota and Montana. Minnesota, South Dakota and Montana also are the most popular origin states for travelers to North Dakota.

- Travelers from Ohio who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.2 trips per traveler compared with 4.5 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Ohio are Indiana, Kentucky, and Pennsylvania. Michigan, Pennsylvania and Indiana are the most popular origin states for travelers to Ohio.

- Travelers from Oregon who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.3 trips per traveler compared with 5.4 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Oregon are Washington, California and Nevada. Washington, California and Idaho are the most popular origin states for travelers to Oregon.




- The number of trips per visitor to Pennsylvania has grown 15 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 43 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Pennsylvania take 3.9 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,214 miles) than by car (1,968 miles).
- Travelers from Pennsylvania who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.8 trips per traveler compared with 4.9 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Pennsylvania are New Jersey, New York and Delaware. New York, New Jersey and Maryland are the most popular origin states for travelers to Pennsylvania.



- Travelers who live in South Dakota took 4.9 million person-trips, an average of 5.9 trips and 3,704 miles per traveler. Visitors to South Dakota took 5.6 million person-trips, an average of 6.3 trips and 4,761 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to South Dakota has grown 70 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 109 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in South Dakota take 5.7 car trips per traveler compared with 1.8 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,715 miles) than by car (3,016 miles).
- Travelers from South Dakota who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 5.6 trips per traveler compared with 7.3 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in South Dakota are Minnesota, North Dakota and Iowa. Minnesota, Nebraska and Iowa are the most popular origin states for travelers to South Dakota.





STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Tennessee

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 70 percent of the households in Tennessee took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Tennessee households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Tennessee took 20.2 million person-trips, an average of 4.5 trips and 3,321 miles per traveler. Visitors to Tennessee took 22.7 million person-trips, an average of 4.2 trips and 2,840 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Tennessee has grown 24 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 41 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Tennessee take 4.0 car trips per traveler compared with 3.0 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,953 miles) than by car (4,420 miles).
- Travelers from Tennessee who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 2.9 trips per traveler compared with 6.6 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Tennessee are Georgia, Florida and Alabama. Georgia, Kentucky and Alabama are the most popular origin states for travelers to Tennessee.

- During 1995, about 87 percent of the households in Texas took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Texas households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Texas took 84.3 million person-trips, an average of 4.8 trips and 3,919 miles per traveler. Visitors to Texas took 76.0 million person-trips, an average of 4.8 trips and 3,521 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Texas has decreased 11 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has declined 6 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Texas take 4.0 car trips per traveler compared with 2.9 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (5,175 miles) than by car (2,275 miles).
- Travelers from Texas who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.5 trips per traveler compared with 5.8 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Texas are Louisiana, Oklahoma and Florida. Louisiana, Oklahoma and New Mexico are the most popular origin states for travelers to Texas.

Utah

- During 1995, about 92 percent of the households in Utah took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Utah households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Utah took 10.9 million person-trips, an average of 4.9 trips and 4,044 miles per traveler. Visitors to Utah took 9.7 million person-trips, an average of 5.9 trips and 5,642 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Utah has grown 79 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 130 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Utah take 4.3 car trips per traveler compared with 2.3 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,540 miles) than by car (2,531 miles).
- Travelers from Utah who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.8 trips per traveler compared with 5.1 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Utah are Nevada, Idaho and California. Idaho, Nevada and Colorado are the most popular origin states for travelers to Utah.

STATE HIGHLIGHTS

Vermont

- People who live in Vermont take 4.7 car trips per traveler compared with 2.0 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,475 miles) than by car (2,410 miles).
- Travelers from Vermont who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.4 trips per traveler compared with 6.4 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Vermont are Massachusetts, New York and New Hampshire. New York, Massachusetts and Connecticut are the most popular origin states for travelers to Vermont.

- During 1995, about 90 percent of the households in Washington took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Washington households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Washington took 26.1 million person-trips, an average of 4.4 trips and 4,455 miles per traveler. Visitors to Washington took 21.6 million person-trips, an average of 4.7 trips and 4,168 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Washington has decreased 10 percent since 1977, but the number of miles per visitor has grown 13 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Washington take 3.8 car trips per traveler compared with 2.2 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (5,455 miles) than by car (2,011 miles).
- Travelers from Washington who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.7 trips per traveler compared with 4.9 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Washington are Oregon, California and Idaho. Oregon, California and Idaho also are the most popular origin states for travelers to Washington.





STATE HIGHLIGHTS

West Virginia

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 66 percent of the households in West Virginia took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. West Virginia households travel less than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in West Virginia took 6.1 million person-trips, an average of 4.3 trips and 2,502 miles per traveler. Visitors to West Virginia took 8.5 million person-trips, an average of 5.5 trips and 3,193 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to West Virginia has grown 42 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 37 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 17 percent and the number of miles has increased 28 percent since 1977.
- People who live in West Virginia take 4.2 car trips per traveler compared with 1.7 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (3,583 miles) than by car (2,158 miles).
- Travelers from West Virginia who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 3.0 trips per traveler compared with 6.5 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in West Virginia are Ohio, Virginia and Pennsylvania. Ohio, Virginia and Pennsylvania also are the most popular origin states for travelers to West Virginia.

Wisconsin

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 80 percent of the households in Wisconsin took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Wisconsin households travel the same as the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Wisconsin took 26.4 million person-trips, an average of 5.7 trips and 3,633 miles per traveler. Visitors to Wisconsin took 26.1 million person-trips, an average of 5.3 trips and 2,766 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Wisconsin has remained the same since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 14 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Wisconsin take 5.3 car trips per traveler compared with 2.1 airplane trips per traveler, however more miles per traveler are by air (4,151 miles) than by car (2,536 miles).
- Travelers from Wisconsin who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 4.3 trips per traveler compared with 6.6 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Wisconsin are Illinois, Minnesota and Michigan. Illinois, Minnesota and Michigan also are the most popular origin states for travelers to Wisconsin.





Wyoming

Long-distance trips account for a significant amount of travel and include a large share of American households. This travel has economic, social and environmental consequences.

- During 1995, about 95 percent of the households in Wyoming took one or more long-distance trips to a destination 100 or more miles away. Wyoming households travel more than the national average which is about 80 percent of all households.
- Travelers who live in Wyoming took 4.1 million person-trips, an average of 7.3 trips and 4,703 miles per traveler. Visitors to Wyoming took 4.7 million person-trips, an average of 6.7 trips and 5,993 miles per traveler.
- The number of trips per visitor to Wyoming has grown 123 percent since 1977, and the number of miles per visitor has grown 78 percent. On average in the United States, the number of trips per traveler has grown 20 percent and the number of miles has increased 39 percent since 1977.
- People who live in Wyoming take 6.8 car trips per traveler compared with 1.7 airplane trips per traveler, however about the same miles per traveler are by air (3,821 miles) as by car (3,823 miles).
- Travelers from Wyoming who live in households with incomes less than \$25,000 travel less often than travelers in households with incomes greater than \$50,000, about 6.1 trips per traveler compared with 9.1 trips per traveler.
- The most popular destination states for travelers who live in Wyoming are Colorado, Montana and South Dakota. Colorado, Utah and Montana are the most popular origin states for travelers to Wyoming.
