PART 71-DESIGNATION OF FEDERAL AIRWAYS, CONTROLLED AIRSPACE, AND REPORTING POINTS (NEW)

Alteration of Transition Area

On June 26, 1963, a Notice of Proposed Rule Making was published in the Federal Register (28 F. R. 6565) stating that the Federal Aviation Agency proposed to alter the Tonopah, Nev., transition area.

Interested persons were afforded an opportunity to participate in the rulemaking through submisssion of comments but no comments were received.

The substance of the proposed amendment having been published and for the reasons stated in the Notice, the following action is taken:

In § 71.181 (27 F. R. 220-139, November 10, 1962), the Tonopah, Nev., transition area is amended to read:

Tonopah, Nev.

That airspace extending upward from 700 feet above the surface within 5 miles W and 3 miles E of the Tonopah VOR 352° and 172° radials, extending from 9 miles N to 2 miles S of the VOR; and that airspace extending upward from 1,200 feet above the surface within a 14-mile radius of the Tonopah VOR, excluding the portions within R-4807 and R-4809.

This amendment shall become effective 0001 EST, January 9, 1964.
