Civil Air Regulations Amendment 26-2

TEMPORARY AIR-TRAFFIC CONTROL-TOWER OPERATOR CERTIFICATES

The Civil Air Regulations require an airman to have in his possession a certificate issued by the Administrator when he is performing the duties of an airman. After June 30, 1947, the Civil Aeronautics Administration will issue all regular airman certificates from Washington, D. C. Thus, applicants for such certificates will be subjected to undue delay after successful completion of the prescribed tests, unless provision is made for the issuance of certificates valid while the regular certificates are being processed in Washington.

The purpose of this rule is to provide for the issuance of a valid interim certificate and to conform these rules to the other airman certification rules.

Effective June 27, 1947, Part 26 of the Civil Air Regulations is amended by adding a new section 26.40 to read as follows:

26.40 Temporary certificates. The Administrator or his authorized representative may issue a temporary air-traffic control-tower operator certificate for a period of not to exceed 90 days, subject to the terms and conditions specified therein by the Administrator.
