SPECIAL CIVIL AIR REGULATION

FLIGHT TEME LIMITATIONS FOR PILOTS NOT REGULARLY ASSIGNED TO ONE TYPE OF CREW

Special Civil Air Regulation SR-3864 which terminates September 19. 1954, provides authority whereby a pilot may serve in more than one type of flight crew without incurring any penalty in terms of maximum permissive flight duty. This authority has heretofore been provided for an experimental period with a view to the establishment of permanent rules for such crew assignments.

The Civil Acronautics Administration has advised the Board that the regulation is a desirable one and not subject to abuse, and that it recommends that the authority granted by SR-386A be continued. Since a proposed major revision of Part 41 of the Civil Air Regulations is being prepared for publication, the Board considers that it is advisable to extend the authority granted by SR-386/ for another year rather than to incorporate this authority in currently effective Part 41. During the development of the revision of Part 41 further consideration and discussion will be given concerning the permanent incorporation of such a provision.

This regulation will not allow evasion of the stricter limitations applicable to smaller crew combinations, but will allow assignment of a pilot in any given month to another type of crew combination without additional flight time limitation if he flies not more than 20 hours in the type of crew to which the more restrictive flight time limitations apply and if such assignment is not interrupted more than once during such month.

Interested persons have been afforded an opportunity to participate in the making of this regulation, and due consideration has been given to all relevant matter presented. Since it imposes no additional burden on any person, this regulation may be made effective without prior notice.

In consideration of the foregoing the Civil Aeronautics Board hereby makes and promulgates the following Special Civil Air Regulation, effective September 19, 1954:

- 1. Contrary provisions of 8 kl.57 of the Civil Air Regulations notwithstanding, the following rules shall apply to the monthly and quarterly flight time limitations of pilots assigned in combinations of two-pilot crows, two-pilot and additional flight crow member crows, or three-pilot and additional flight crow member crows.
 - 2. A pilot who is assigned to duty aloft for more than 20 hours in two-pilot crews in a given month, or whose assignment in such crews is interrupted more than once in the month by assignment to a crew consisting of two or more pilots and an additional flight crew member, shall be governed by the provisions of # 41.54.
 - 3. Except for a pilot coming within the provisions of paragraph 2, a pilot who is assigned to duty cloft for more than 20 hours in two-pilot and additional flight crew member crows in a given month, or whose assignment in such crews is interrupted more than once in the month by assignment to a crew consisting of three pilots and an additional flight crew member, shall be governed by the provisions of § 11.55.
 - 4. A pilot to whom the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 are not applicable, assigned to duty aloft for a total of 20 hours or less within a given month in two-pilot crews with or without additional flight crew members, shall be governed by the provisions of 8 41.56.
 - 5. A pilot assigned to each of two-pilot, two-pilot and additional flight crew mamber, and three-pilot and additional flight crew member crews in a given month, who is not governed by the provisions of paragraphs 2, 3, or 4, shall be governed by the provisions of § 41.55.

This regulation shall supersede Special Civil Air Regulation No. SR-386: and shall terminate one year from its effective date, unless sooner superseded or rescinded by the Found.
