Notices of Parts purchased should state the specific Part numbers, quantities purchased, and whether future amendments and special regulations are desired.

How to remit: The Government Printing Office requires that remittance be made in advance of shipment of publications, either by coupons, sold in sets of 20 for \$1 and good until used, or by check or money order payable to the <u>Superintendent of Documents</u>. Currency may be sent at sender's risk. Postage stamps, foreign money, defaced or smooth coins are not acceptable. Deposits of \$10 or more are accepted against which orders may be placed without making individual remittances.

Postage is not required for shipment within the continental United States or its possessions. Shipments to foreign countries require an additional amount for postage of about one-third of the price of the publication. Remittances from foreign countries should be made by international money order, or draft on an American bank, payable to the Superintendent of Documents. A discount of 25 percent is allowable to book dealers and purchasers of 100 or more copies of a single publication to be mailed to one address, on condition that the purchasers will adhere to the public sales price set by the Superintendent of Documents and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter.

Note: Manuals, which supplement the Parts of the Civil Air Regulations, and <u>Regulations of the Administrator</u>, are published by the <u>Civil Aero-</u> <u>nautics Administration</u>, U. S. Department of Commerce, <u>Washington 25</u>, D.C.
