#### The Next Generation of North American Bike Facilities

The National Association of City Transportation Officials (NACTO) released a new guidance, titled <u>"Designing for All Ages & Abilities: Contextual Guidance for High-Comfort Bicycle Facilities."</u> The guidance focuses on two key safety factors, vehicle speeds and traffic volumes, to give cities the tools they need to decide what street treatments will most improve bicycle safety.

#### California's Approach to Balancing Infrastructure and Stewardship

The Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA's) Successes in Stewardship newsletter highlights environmental streamlining and stewardship practices from across the country. The November 2017 edition of the newsletter is titled, "California's North Coast Corridor Program Balances Infrastructure Demands and Environmental Stewardship." The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and other stakeholders developed a 40-year, \$6 billion program to address the needs of the North Coast Corridor aiming to improve quality of life for residents, promote regional economic growth, and protect and enhance the coastal environment.

#### **TRB Bicycle Transportation Research Papers**

The Transportation Research Board (TRB) published a compilation of 19 <u>research papers</u> on bicycle transportation. Topics covered by the papers include bicycle travel in rural areas, travel patterns of bikeshare users, and the impact of bicycle facilities on residential properties.



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#### **5th Annual AARP Livable Communities National Conference**

The <u>2017 American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) Livable Communities National Conference</u>, which took place on November 15, 2017, was an opportunity for elected officials, planning professionals, local leaders, and community advocates from throughout the nation to share ideas and innovative solutions for making communities more livable for people of all ages. # Advancement of Performance-Based Scenario Planning for Regional Planning and Decision-Making: A Synthesis Report

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published a <u>report</u> on performance-based scenario planning. This report synthesizes key content and outcomes identified as the result of a scenario planning workshop, interviews with regional planning organizations, and subsequent research. This document explores how regional planning organizations utilize scenario planning in their work, what tools they are using, and how more agencies can adopt scenario planning approaches.
