### FHWA Announces \$8.9 Million Available for Tribal Transportation Grants

On July 22, the *Federal Highway Administration* (FHWA) announced the availability of \$8.9 million in competitive grants from the Tribal Transportation Program Safety Funds program. There will be a webinar on the program on August 3, 2016. Complete proposals must be submitted by September 16, 2016.

### **Climate Change and Environmental Justice Fact Sheet**

### NHTSA's 2015 Data Shows 7.7 Percent Rise in Traffic Deaths

Preliminary analysis of the *National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's* (NHTSA) traffic data shows that <u>motor vehicle traffic deaths rose 7.7 percent from 2014</u>. NHTSA noted that though the data requires additional analysis, the most significant increases came from pedestrians and bicyclists.

### Mid-South Greenprint Releases Semi-Annual Report

The Mid-South (Greater Memphis-Shelby County) Greenprint project, which began with a *Department of Housing and Urban Development* (HUD) Regional Planning Grant, recently released its <u>2016 semi-annual report</u>. One hundred corridor miles of the Greenprint's networked paths, trails, and green spaces have been completed.

#### **EPA Announces Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Grants**

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recently announced the availability of <u>Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Grants</u> of up to \$200,000 each for area-wide projects focused on brownfields assessment, cleanup, and reuse for fiscal year 2017. The deadline for submitting proposals is August 10, 2016.

### **Smart Growth America Launches Rural Development Program**

Smart Growth America recently launched a <u>Rural Development Program</u>, which is designed to help local leaders strengthen rural economies through a smart growth approach to development. Many rural areas are struggling to compete with rapidly growing urbanized areas while maintaining their unique character.

#### SUMC Releases Toolkit to Help Cities Expand Shared Mobility in Disadvantaged Communities

The Shared-Use Mobility Center (SUMC) recently released its Shared Mobility Toolkit, which is designed to help cities and public sector leaders better realize the benefits of shared mobility, especially for economically-vulnerable communities.
