Announcements

FTA Announces \$8 Million for New "Mobility on Demand" Solutions

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) announced the <u>availability of \$8 million</u> for a new demonstration program to demonstrate and evaluate innovative approaches to integrated "Mobility on Demand Sandbox Solutions" within a public transportation network. Proposals are due by July 5, 2016.

Smart Cities Challenge Finalists Make Final Pitch

On June 9, the Mayors of the seven finalist cities in the *U.S. Department of Transportation's* (USDOT) Smart City Challenge made final pitches for why their cities should win the competition.

USDOT Releases Transportation Dictionary

The *U.S. Department of Transportation* (USDOT) released an <u>online dictionary</u> of over 9,000 terms and acronyms related to transportation which were obtained from various public and private transportation publications and databases.

Planning Rule Webinar Recording Available

On June 14, the *Federal Highway Administration* (FHWA) and *Federal Transit Administration* (FTA) jointly hosted a webinar on the recently issued Planning Final Rule. <u>A recording of the webinar</u> is now available, and there will be a second webinar on the same material on Wednesday, July 13.

Round Nine of Partners for Places Now Open

In partnership with the *Urban Sustainability Directors Network*, the *Funders' Network for Smart Growth and Livable Communities* announced the opening of <u>Round Nine of Partners for Places</u>, a grant program that creates opportunities for cities and counties to improve communities by building partnerships between local government sustainability offices and place-based foundations. Applications are due by July 25.

Communicating the Connection: Transportation and Public Health

For its 10th annual competition, the Planning and Environment Group of the *Transportation Research Board* is seeking out <u>best practices in communicating the connection between transportation and public health</u> to the public. Entries are due by July 25, and winners will be notified in early October.

Call for Session Proposals for New Partners for Smart Growth Conference Issued

The Local Government Commission (LGC) has issued <u>a call for session proposals</u> for its 2017 New Partners for Smart Growth Conference, which will take place in St. Louis, MO, on Feburary 2-4, 2017. Applications for session proposals are due by June 30, 2016.

Abstracts Due for 9th Annual Urban Design Conference

The abstract submission period is now open for the <u>9th International Urban Design Conference</u>, which will take place in Canberra, Australia on November 7-9, 2016. Abstracts should be no longer than 300 words and are due on July 25.
