USDOT Announces Every Place Counts Design Challenge

As part of the Ladders of Opportunity Initiative, the *U.S. Department of Transportation* (USDOT) announced the <u>Reconnecting Communities Design Challenge</u>. Applicants must register by May 20, 2016 and applications are due on June 3

Senate Appropriations Committee approves FY2017 THUD Bill

The Senate Appropriations Committee has approved the FY2017 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies (THUD) Appropriations Bill that includes \$16.9 billion in discretionary spending for the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT).

On April 22, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) released a <u>Notice of Proposed Rulemaking</u> (NRPM) to propose national performance management measure regulations as required by the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) and the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act ("FAST Act").

Some lower-income residents of Washington, DC, will be able to sign up for <u>Capital Bikeshare memberships for \$5 a year</u> under a new community partnership program. Participants will also receive a free Capital Bikeshare helmet.
