USDOT Announces Projects Selected to Receive \$22.5 Million in Grants for Clean Buses, Infrastructure

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Transit Administration (FTA) announced the <u>latest project selections</u> for the Low- and No-Emission Vehicle Deployment Program, known as Low-No. Seven transit providers in five States will receive a share of \$22.5 million toward transit buses and related facilities that utilize battery-electric, fuel cell, and other innovative technologies to reduce harmful greenhouse gas emissions and improve operating efficiency.

USDOT Announces \$20.5 Million to Improve Access to Transit in Communities Around the Country

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Transit Administration (FTA) announced that \$20.5 million in competitive grant funds are available to support planning efforts that improve access to public transit in communities across the Country, provided through FTA's Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) Planning Pilot Program.
