The Obama Administration Announced the Third and Final Round of Promise Zones Competition

On December 18, 2015, the Secretaries Castro of HUD and Vilsack of USDA announced the opening of the third and final round of <u>Promise Zone Competition</u>. Promise Zones are high poverty communities where the Federal government partners with local leaders to increase economic activity. The application deadline is Tuesday, February 23 at 5:00 PM ET.

Applications Are Being Accepted for the 2016 Sustainable Cities Design Academy

The American Architectural Foundation's (AAF) Center for Design and the City is <u>now accepting applications</u> for the 2016 Sustainable Cities Design Academy. The AAF provides a limited number of local leaders with sustainable design technical assistance during a 2 1/2-day design working shop in Washington, DC. The application deadline is Thursday, January 28 at 5:00 PM ET.
