USDA's Strategic Economic and Community Development Program Grant Opportunity

The U.S Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Strategic Economic and Community Development Program is now <u>accepting</u> <u>grant applications</u>. The application deadline is 5:00 PM ET on July 31, 2015.

Partners for Places Round 7 Grant Opportunity

Partners for Places is a <u>matching grant program</u> that improves U.S. and Canadian communities by building partnerships between local government sustainaiblity leaders and place-based foundations. Grants are between \$25,000 and \$75,000, with a 1:1 match required. It is anticipated that 8-12 projects will be supported over a 12-month period this round. Proposals are due July 27, 2015 by midnight in the applicant's local time zone.


Host an NHI Training Course on Pedestrian Facility Design in Your Area

NHTSA Published Traffic Safety Fact Sheet on School-Transportation-Related Crashes

The National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA) created a brief fact sheet about "School-Transportation-Related Crashes from 2004 to 2013." Compiling data between 2004 and 2013, NHTSA found that 1,344 people were killed in school-transportation-related crashes, an average of 134 fatalities per year.
