EPA Seeks Applications for Environmental Justice Small Grants Program

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking <u>applications to support activities designed to empower and educate communities to understand environmental and public health issues</u> and to identify ways to address these issues at the local level. The funding will focus on proposals supporting community-based preparedness and community climate resiliency efforts. Applications are due on January 9, 2015.

The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) hosted the <u>Creating Access to Opportunity Webinar</u> on December 9, 2014. EPA Seeks Applications for Environmental Education Grants Programs

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is accepting <u>grant proposals to support environmental education</u> <u>projects</u> that promote environmental awareness and stewardship (due February 2, 2015). EPA is also accepting grant proposals for <u>Environmental Education Local Grants</u> (due March 6, 2015) to support locally-focused environmental education projects that increase public awareness and knowledge about environmental issues.

HUD Announces National Disaster Resilience Competition

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD's) <u>National Disaster Resilience Competition</u> has made \$1 billion available to states with counties that experienced a Presidentially Declared Major Disaster in 2011, 2012, or 2013. Applications that address unmet needs as well as vulnerabilities to future extreme events, stresses, threats, hazards, or other shocks in areas that were most impacted and distressed as a result of the effects of a qualified disaster will be accepted until March 16, 2015.
