Whereas a new crash report form (OH-1) with many revisions was introduced in 2000, the format and detail of certain data may be represented differently than in the past. Most of the data files used to generate this report are subject to changes over time due to continuing efforts to assure the data contained therein is as accurate as possible. As such, some details of these reports may not be duplicable from the current Ohio Integrated Traffic Records System data files.

# APPENDIX

## Definitions

**Accident:** An accident is an unstabilized situation which includes at least one harmful event.

**Alcohol-Related Crash:** A crash in which a vehicle driver or pedestrian had been drinking.

**Animals:** *Examples:* Horse and rider, Dog team drawing a sled, Team of horses drawing a sled, Burro carrying a load of firewood, Mule towing a boat on a canal, deer, dog, cow, and others.

**Automobile:** An automobile is a motor vehicle other than a motorcycle or utility vehicle consisting of a transport device designed for carrying ten or fewer persons.

**Bicycle:** A pedalcycle (a non-motorized other road vehicle propelled by pedalling) which has two wheels.

**Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC):** The level of alcohol in a person's bloodstream. In Ohio, the legal limit of .10 equals a blood alcohol concentration of one part per thousand.

**Bus:** A bus is a motor vehicle consisting primarily of a transport device designed for carrying more than ten persons.

**Child Safety Seat:** Safety devices designed to fit in motor vehicles that keep children securely in place. The seats are required by law for children who weigh either under 40 pounds or who are less than four years old, or both.

**Child Restraints:** Devices found in motor vehicles for the protection of vehicle occupants that keep children in their seats, preventing them from being ejected from the motor vehicle upon impact. Restraint devices include shoulder belts, lap belts, shoulder/lap belts and child safety seats.

**Collision Accident:** A collision accident is a road vehicle accident other than an overturning accident in which the first harmful event is a collision of a road vehicle in transport with another road vehicle, other property or pedestrians.

**Crash:** An occurrence involving a moving motor vehicle that produces bodily injury or property damage. Crashes are generally caused by driver error, a defect in the vehicle or in the road pavement, or an obstruction on the pavement. It occurs on a road, or after the motor vehicle runs off the road, but before events are stabilized.

**Crash Severity:** The most severe injury, or in the absence of injury, property damage involved in the crash.

- Fatal Injury
- Injury
- PDO (Property Damage Only)
- Unknown (Investigation reveals no injury or property damage, or damage less than \$400.)

**Damage:** Damage is harm to property that reduces the monetary value of that property.

**Drinking Driver or Pedestrian:** A person identified as one who had been drinking at the time of the crash regardless of the level of impairment.

**Driver:** A driver is an occupant who is in actual physical control of a transport vehicle or, for an out-of-control vehicle, an occupant who was in control until control was lost; any person of any age operating a vehicle, including non-motorized vehicles.

**Driver in Error:** A term that identifies the person, animal or condition that was the primary cause of a motor vehicle crash.

**Ejection:** Ejection code for occupant. Not Ejected, Totally Ejected, Partially Ejected, Not Applicable, Unknown.

**Fatal Accident:** A fatal accident is any injury accident that results in one or more fatal injuries.

**Fatal Injury:** A fatal injury is any injury that results in death within 30 days after the crash.

**Fatality:** A fatality is any death resulting from a fatal injury.

**Fatality vs. Fatal Crash:** A fatality is a death that results from a traffic crash. A fatal crash is a motor vehicle crash (single or multiple) that results in the death of one or more people. A fatal crash can cause one or more fatalities.

**First Harmful Event:** The location of the first harmful event determines the trafficway classification for the traffic accident. When the first harmful event does not occur on a trafficway the traffic accident should be attributed to the class of trafficway on which the unstabilized situation originated. The first harmful event is listed from the sequence of events that produced the first property damage, injury or death.

**Gender:** The sex of the motorist/non-motorist. Male, Female, Unknown.

**Harmful Event:** A harmful event is an occurrence of injury or damage.

**Holiday:** Refers to the length of the holiday weekend period, including the hours of 6 P.M. to midnight of the day preceding the holiday.

**In Transport:** The term "in transport" denotes the state or condition of a transport vehicle which is in motion or within the portion of a transport way ordinarily used by similar transport vehicles. When applied to motor vehicles, "in transport" means in motion or on a roadway.

**Incapacitating Injury (*Serious Visible*):** An incapacitating injury is any injury, other than a fatal injury, which prevents the injured person from walking, driving or normally continuing the activities the person was capable of performing before the injury occurred.

*Inclusions:*

- Severe lacerations
- Broken or distorted limbs
- Skull or chest injuries
- Abdominal injuries
- Unconsciousness at or when taken from the accident scene
- Unable to leave the accident scene without assistance
- And others

*Exclusions:*

- Momentary unconsciousness

- And others

**Injury:** An injury is bodily harm to a person.

- No Injury
- Possible Injury (*Non-Visible Claimed*)
- Nonincapacitating (*Minor Visible*)
- Incapacitating (*Serious Visible*)
- Fatal Injury
- Unknown

**Injury Accident:** An injury accident is any road vehicle accident that results in one or more injuries.

**Insurance:** If the insurance carrier and/or agent which insures the liability of the owner/operator is listed, the driver is insured. If financial responsibility is not proven, the driver is uninsured. A non-motorist, such as a bicyclist or pedestrian, is not required to show proof of financial responsibility.

**Light Conditions:** Lighting conditions (primary-normal conditions) at the time of the crash. Daylight, Dawn, Dusk, Dark – Lighted Roadway, Dark – Not Lighted, Dark – Unknown Lighting, Glare, Other, Unknown.

**Manner of Collision or Impact:** The manner in which the crash occurred. Not collision between two vehicles in transport, rear-end, head-on, rear-to-rear, backing, angle, sideswipe-same direction, sideswipe-opposite direction, unknown.

**Moped:** A moped is a speed-limited motor-driven cycle which may be propelled by pedalling.

**Most Harmful Event:** The most severe or significant harmful event is chosen from the sequence of events that produced the most property damage, most severe injury or death. If injury occurred, the event that caused the most serious injury or death is listed. Injuries always supersede property damage. If only property damage occurred, the sequence of events is listed that caused the greatest degree of damage.

**Motor Vehicle:** A motor vehicle is any motorized (mechanically or electrically powered) road vehicle not operated on rails.

**Motor Vehicle Accident:** A motor vehicle accident is a transport accident that (1) involves a motor vehicle in transport, (2) is not an aircraft accident or watercraft accident, and (3) does not include any harmful event involving a railway train in transport prior to involvement of a motor vehicle in transport.

**Motor Vehicle-Train Crash:** A crash whose sequence of events includes a railway vehicle or whose unit type is a train.

**Motorcycle:** A motorcycle is any motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of its operator and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground.

*Inclusions:* Large motorcycle, Motor-driven cycle, Speed-limited motor-driven cycle, Moped, Motor scooter, Motorized or motor-assisted bicycle, and others

**Motorist:** A motorist is any occupant of a motor vehicle in transport.

*Examples:*

**Passenger Vehicle**

- Sub-Compact, Compact, Mid Size, Full Size, Minivan, Sport Utility Vehicle

**Truck**

- Pickup, Panel/Van, Single Unit Truck; 2 Axles, 6 Tires, Single Unit Truck; 3 Or More Axles, Truck/Trailer, Fifth Wheel Or Converter Dolly

*Tractor-Trailer Truck*

- Truck Tractor (Bobtail), Tractor/Semi-Trailer, Tractor/Double - Short, Tractor/Double – Long, Tractor/Triples

**Motorcycle**

**Public Safety Vehicle**

- Police Vehicle, Fire Truck, Ambulance/Rescue

**Public Transportation**

- Public Bus, Taxi ,Train

**Other Motor Vehicles**

- Motorized Bicycle, School Bus, Church Bus, , Other Bus, , Motor Home, , Farm Vehicle, Farm Equipment, Snowmobile, Construction Equipment, All Others (motorist)

**Unknown**

**Nonincapacitating Evident Injury (*Minor Visible*):** A nonincapacitating evident injury is any injury, other than a fatal injury or an incapacitating injury, which is evident to observers at the scene of the accident in which the injury occurred.

*Inclusions:*

- Lump on head, abrasions, bruises, minor lacerations
- And others

*Exclusions:*

- Limping (the injury cannot be seen)
- And others

**Non-motorist:** A non-motorist is any person other than a motorist.

*Inclusions:*

- Pedestrians
- Occupants of motor vehicles not in transport
- Occupants of transport vehicles other than motor vehicles

*Examples:*

**Non-Motor Vehicles**

- Animal W/Rider, Animal W/Buggy, Bicycle, Pedestrian, Pedalcyclist (bicycle, tricycle, unicycle, pedal car), Skater, Other-non motorist (wheelchair, etc)

**Unknown**

**Nonfatal Injury Accident:** A nonfatal injury accident is any injury accident other than a fatal accident.

**Noninjury Accident:** A noninjury accident is any road vehicle accident other than an injury accident. A noninjury accident is also called a property-damage-only accident.

**Occupant:** An occupant is any person who is part of a transport vehicle.

**Occupant Restraints:** Devices found in motor vehicles for the protection of vehicle occupants that keep the driver and passengers in their seats, preventing them from being ejected from the motor vehicle upon impact. Restraint devices include shoulder belts, lap belts, shoulder/lap belts and child safety seats.

**Occupant Restraint Usage:** The usage of occupant restraints reported in this document is based on either the usage indicated in traffic crash reports or observed usage. Usage rates from field observations include front seat occupants and small children covered by Ohio's child safety seat law.

**Other Road Vehicle:** An other road vehicle is any road vehicle other than a motor vehicle.

*Inclusions:* Animal-drawn vehicle (any type), Animal harnessed to a conveyance, Animal carrying a person, Street car, Pedalcycle, and others.

**Passenger:** A passenger is any occupant of a road vehicle other than its driver.

**Pedalcycle:** A pedalcycle is a non-motorized other road vehicle propelled by pedalling.

*Inclusions:* Bicycle, tricycle, unicycle, pedalcar, and others.

**Pedalcyclist:** A pedalcyclist is any occupant of a pedalcycle in transport.

**Pedestrian:** A pedestrian is any person who is not an occupant. *Inclusions:* Pedestrian, Skater.

**Possible Injury (Non-Visible Claimed):** A possible injury is any injury reported or claimed which is not a fatal injury, incapacitating injury or nonincapacitating evident injury.

- Momentary unconsciousness
- Claim of injuries not evident
- Limping, complaint of pain, nausea, hysteria
- And others

**Probable Causes:** Crashes whose unit is in error and listed by contributing circumstances (the actions of the motorist / non-motorist which contributed to the crash).

**Property:** Property is any physical object other than a person.

**Property Damage Only (PDO) Crash:** A traffic crash that results in no injuries or fatalities. Ohio law requires that all crashes resulting in more than \$400 in damage be reported to the Ohio Department of Public Safety on the OH-1 Traffic Crash Report.

**Railway:** A railway is any private way reserved primarily for land vehicles moving persons or property from one place to another on rails.

**Railway Accident:** A railway accident is a transport accident that (1) involves a railway train in transport and (2) is not an aircraft accident, watercraft accident or motor vehicle accident.

**Railway Train:** A railway train is any motorized railway vehicle.

**Railway Vehicle:** A railway vehicle is any land vehicle that is (1) designed primarily for, or in use for, moving persons or property from one place to another on rails and (2) not in use on a land way other than a railway.

**Road Vehicle:** A road vehicle is any land vehicle other than a railway vehicle.

**Safety Equipment:** Safety restraint equipment in use by the occupant at the time of the crash. Includes motorcycle helmet for cyclists and safety equipment used by a non-motorist.

**Motorist:** None Used, Shoulder Belt Only, Lab Belt Only, Shoulder/Lap Belt, Child Safety Seat, Motorcycle Helmet Used

**Non-Motorist:** None Used, Helmet Used, Protective Pads (Elbows, Knee Shins, etc.), Reflective Clothing, Lighting, Other, Unknown

**School Bus:** A school bus is a motor vehicle used for the transportation of any school pupil at or below the 12th-grade level to or from a public or private school or school-related activity. A motor vehicle is not a school bus while on trips which involve the transportation exclusively of other passengers or exclusively for other purposes.

**Seating Position:** The location of the occupant in, or outside of the vehicle prior to the crash.

**Sequence of Events:** The events in sequence for the unit. As many as four events can be listed on the Traffic Crash Report including the most harmful event, and the first harmful event in the order they occurred.

**Speed Related Crash:** A traffic crash in which one or more vehicles were reported as exceeding the posted speed limit and/or where the reporting officer indicated that excessive tablespeed for roadway conditions or loss of control was a contributing factor.

**Traffic Unit:** A traffic unit is a road vehicle or a pedestrian.

**Trailer:** A trailer is a road vehicle designed to be drawn by another road vehicle.

**Transport Vehicle:** A transport vehicle consists of one or more devices or animals and their load.

**Truck:** A truck is a motor vehicle designed primarily for carrying property.

**Truck Driver:** A driver who is operating a truck (Pickup, Panel/Van, Single Unit Truck; 2 Axles, 6 Tires, Single Unit Truck; 3 Or More Axles, Truck/Trailer, Tractor-Trailer Truck, Truck Tractor (Bobtail), Tractor/Semi-Trailer, Tractor/Double - Short, Tractor/Double – Long, Fifth Wheel Or Converter Dolly, Tractor/Triples).

**Unit:** Includes motorists and non-motorists.

**Unit Error:** The motorist / non-motorist which had the most causative bearing on the crash.

**Utility Vehicle:** An utility vehicle is a motor vehicle other than a motorcycle or bus consisting primarily of a transport device designed for carrying ten or fewer persons, and generally considered a multi-purpose vehicle that is designed to have off-road capabilities. These vehicles are generally four-wheel-drive (4 x 4) and have increased ground clearance.

**Van:** A van is a motor vehicle consisting primarily of a transport device which has a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less and is basically a “box on wheels” that is identifiable by its enclosed passenger and/or cargo area, step-up floor, and relatively short (or nonexistent) hood.

**Weather Conditions:** Weather conditions at the time of the crash. Clear, Cloudy, Fog, Smog, Smoke, Rain, Sleet, Hail (Freezing Rain Drizzle), Snow, Severe Crosswinds, Blowing Sand, Soil Dirt, Snow, Other, Unknown.

**Youthful Driver:** A driver is considered a youthful driver if his or her age at the time of the crash was between 16 and 24, inclusive.

*For more detailed definitions, please see the State of Ohio Department of Public Safety – Ohio Traffic Crash Procedure Manual and the ANSI D16.1-1996 – Manual on Classifications of Motor Vehicle Traffic Accidents.*
