Fellow Montanans:

I would like to take the opportunity afforded by publication of the Montana Highway Patrol's annual report for 2010 to thank a small group of people who are making a difference for all of us. This is not a group any of us want to sign up for, since the price of membership is the loss of a beloved family member to an impaired driver.



This legislative session, I have witnessed firsthand the impact of their message. And so, on behalf of the Patrol and all Montanans, I want to acknowledge the victims who have found the courage to stand before legislative committees and share their stories of loss and enduring grief:

- **Becky Sturdevant**, whose son Trooper Evan Schneider was killed when his patrol car was hit head on by a drunk driver in the Kalispell area in 2008. Becky has since become heavily involved with Mothers Against Drunk Drivers, working tirelessly to change Montana's drinking culture.
- **Tawny Haynes** of Kalispell, whose husband Trooper Mike Haynes was killed in 2009 when he was hit head on in the early hours of the morning by a drunk driver on the wrong side of a divided highway. Hayne's two children were just 4 and 1½ years old at the time of his death.
- **Missoula Sheriff Carl Ibsen**, whose wife Judy Wang, a respected state prosecutor, was killed in 2009 when her car was rear-ended by an impaired driver as she returned home from a domestic violence conference in Billings.
- **Karl Pentecost, Snr.**, who with his wife is now raising their two young grandsons after a drunk driver killed their son and daughter-in-law in the summer of 2009.
- **John Trehwella**, whose wife of nearly 40 years, Merry Jane, was killed in 2010 by a drunk driver who ran a stop light in Billings.

In an effort to spare others what they have experienced, they shared their stories to bring home the terrible cost of drunk and drugged drivers.

Montana's legislators on both sides of the aisle have responded. With the support of the 62nd Legislature, this session we have made genuine progress in Montana's DUI laws. Many of the DUI bills proposed or supported by the Department of Justice have become law. These are laws we sorely needed.

- **The 24/7 Sobriety Program** received strong bipartisan support. Under the program, anyone arrested for a second or subsequent DUI will be required to submit to a breath test twice a day, every day – paid for by the offender. The bill was sponsored by Rep. Steve Lavin, who serves as a Highway Patrol Trooper in Kalispell.
- SB 15 creates the offense of **aggravated DUI** at 0.16 BAC and higher. This will save lives by targeting hard core drinkers and drivers, and allowing the court system to impose longer probationary periods on those offenders who pose the greatest risk to the public.

Credit for this progress also goes to the countless citizens who, through their testimony, letters to their newspapers, and phone calls to the legislators have demanded change.

Finally, I want to acknowledge the continuing efforts of the men and women of the Montana Highway Patrol to keep our highways and our citizens safe. Sometimes that task is especially dangerous, as the shooting death last December of Patrol **Trooper David DeLaittre**, 23, reminded us. David was shot and killed during a traffic stop near Three Forks. He will be remembered as a fine young trooper, proudly following in his father's footsteps.

Dear Attorney General Bullock:

I respectfully submit the Montana Highway Patrol's annual report for 2010. The report is required by Montana statute and summarizes all reported crashes investigated by Montana law enforcement officers. The information is gathered through the efforts of many people, and the data from the investigations helps agencies on the Federal, State, and Local level to reduce the number and severity of vehicle crashes in our state.

Traffic fatalities dropped more than 14 percent in 2010, which is good news, since it is the third year in a row that fatalities have dropped. The drop was influenced in large part by a 42.55 percent reduction in fatalities in which alcohol was a factor. This represents forty lives saved in the past year. I am cautiously optimistic that Montana has begun to address its long running issue of drinking and driving. The Montana Highway Patrol will continue to support the efforts of the Montana Legislature as they seek to create effective public policies that address the issue of impaired driving. Even one DUI fatality is too many.

I sincerely wish that I could report only good news, but that is not the case. For the fourth consecutive calendar year our agency has suffered a tragic loss. On December 1st, Trooper David DeLaitre was killed in a shootout with a suspect near Three Forks. David was with the patrol for a little over two years and was only 23 years old at the time of his death. David was a second generation member of the MHP and his passing will leave a void that cannot ever be truly filled. Trooper DeLaitre's badge #269 is forever retired from service with the Montana Highway Patrol.

As always, the Montana Highway Patrol is proud of the work that we do on a daily basis to improve public safety in our state. Montana is a great place to live and work, and through partnerships with other law enforcement agencies, the Department of Transportation, and your office we will continue to work towards an even safer future.

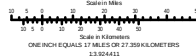

Strategic Traffic Enforcement Team (STET).

The STET team of the Montana Highway Patrol was introduced in 2008 and remained in patrol for all of 2009 and 2010. Funded by the Department of Transportation, Highway Traffic Safety Division, due to a grant application by MHP, this team of troops consists of 4 full-time troopers and 1 sergeant. The STET team conducts a series of intensified saturation patrols throughout the state of Montana during the entire year, concentrating their efforts on those notoriously dangerous, high-crash highway corridors in the state. The team performs high visibility patrols in an attempt to discourage negative driving habits with special attention to speed in these high crash areas. STET troopers spend 80% of on duty hours patrolling the roadways with the Sergeant patrolling 75% of all on duty time. STET enforcement has had a very positive effect on the areas patrolled, the 6122 hours of concentrated enforcement yielded:

- Suspended Licenses – 126
- Uninsured Motorists – 997
- Truck Speeders – 104
- Seat belt citations -- 475
- DUI and drug arrests -- 54
- Speeding citations and warnings – 5148
- Total citations—3374
- Total warnings--7263
- Total citizen contacts -- 6478

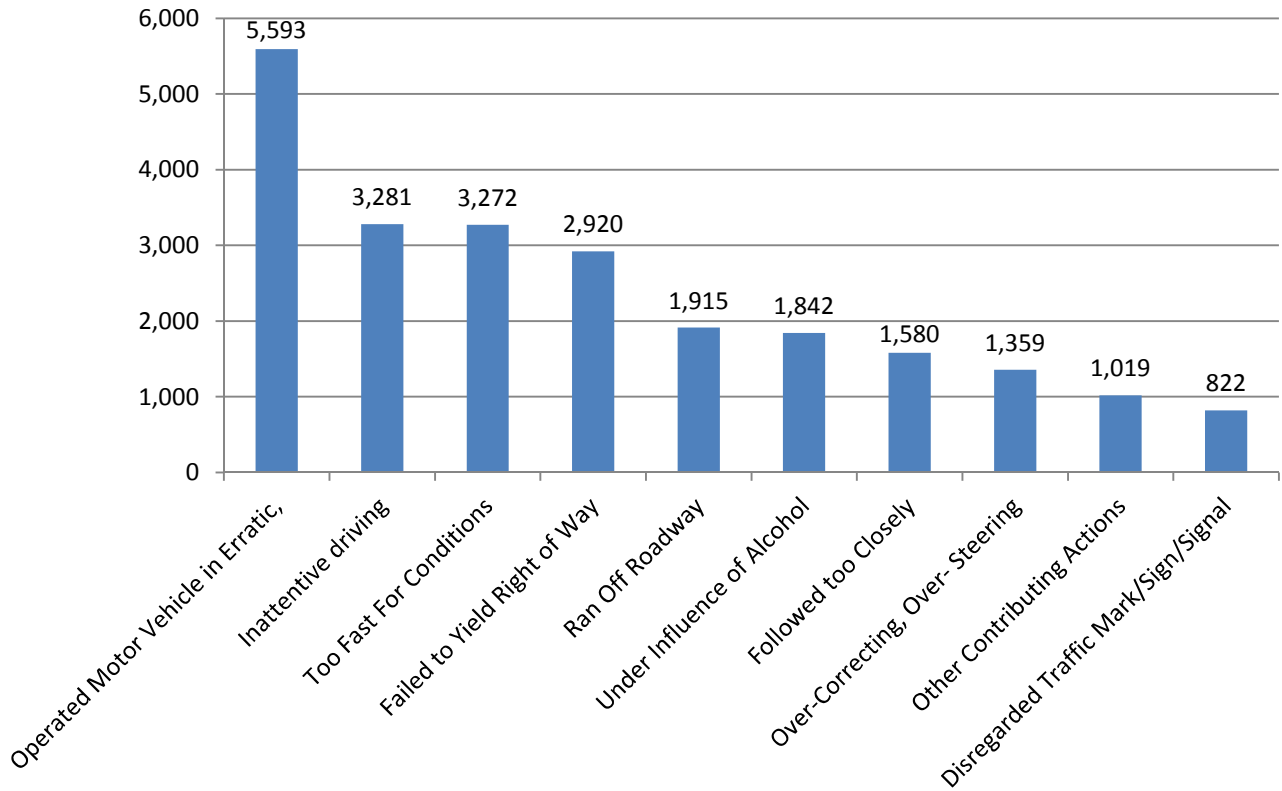

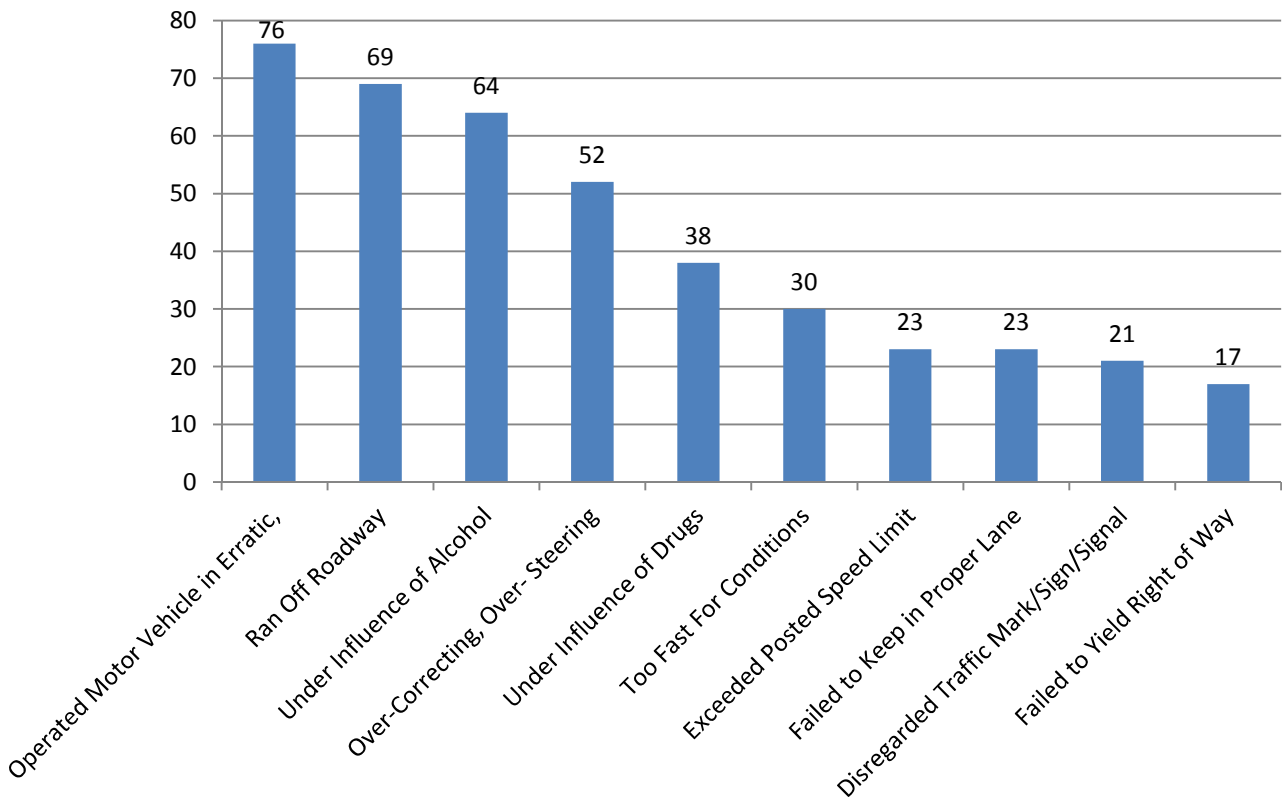

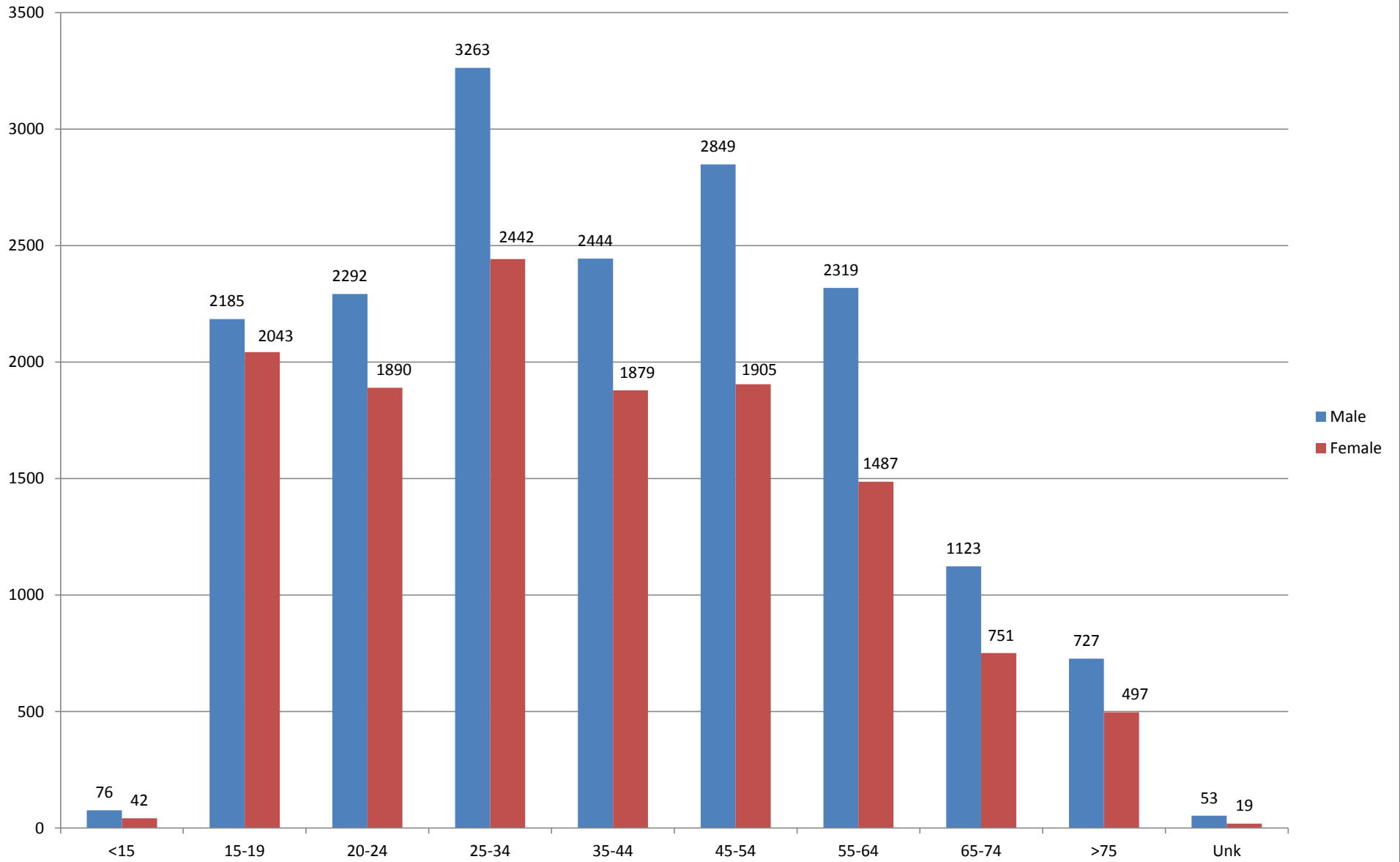

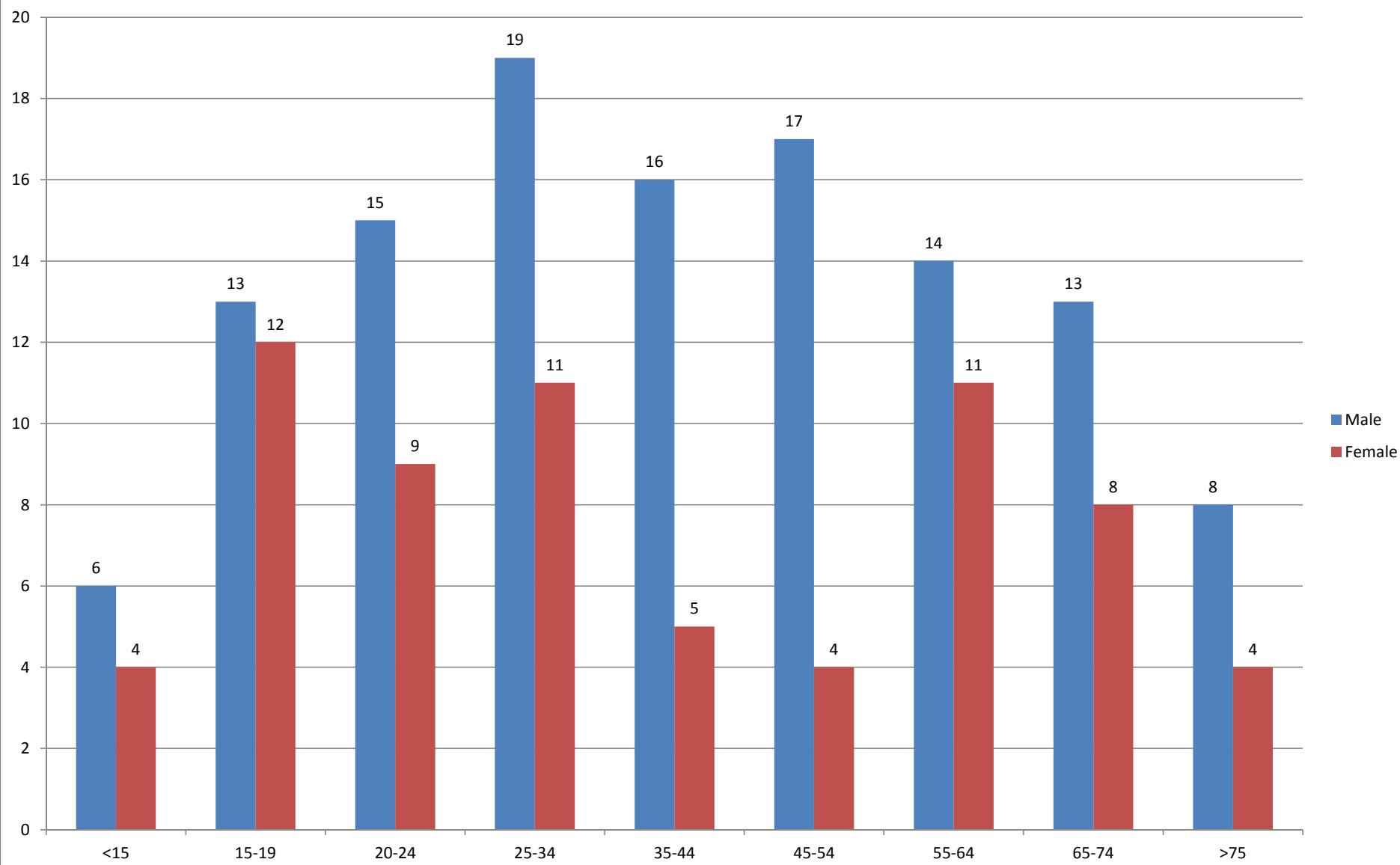

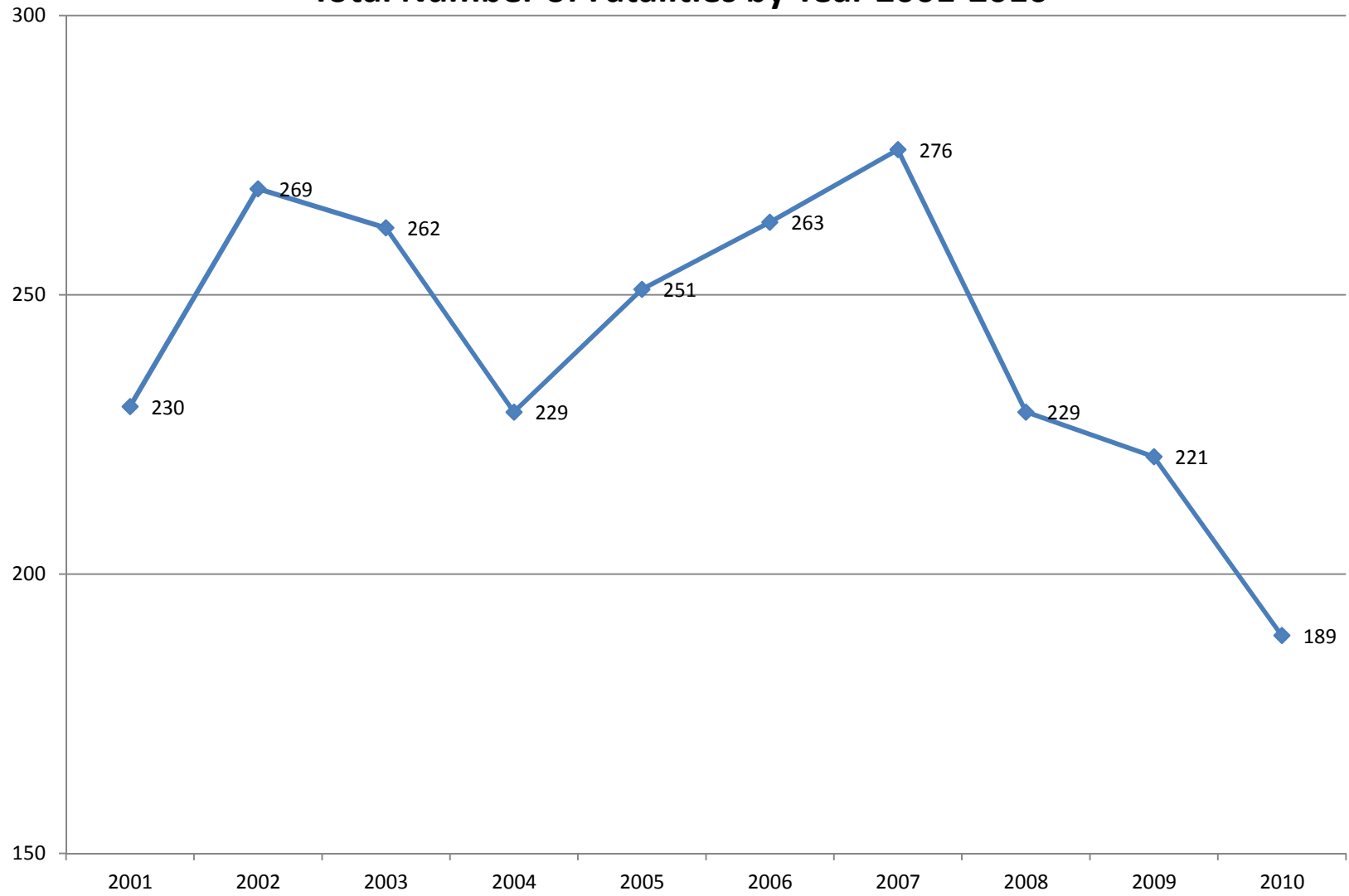
