SUBJECT : MAINTENANCE SYMPOSIUM - CONTINUED RELIABILITY OF TRANSPORT
TYPE AIRCRAFT PROPULSION SYSTEMS

The Federal Aviation Agency will hold a symposium at its Headquarters Office, Washington, D.C., November 17-18, 1965, to exchange ideas on the general subject of propulsion system reliability. Specific areas to be discussed will be overhaul time, total life limits for parts, and how such life limits are established, revised, and monitored.
