SUBJECT: MAINTENANCE SYMPOSIUM - MAINTAINABILITY AND RELIABILITY OF AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS

The Federal Aviation Administration will hold its annual maintenance symposium at the FAA Aeronautical Center, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on November 7, 8, and 9, 1967. This year's theme will be maintainability and reliability of aircraft systems and components; i.e., electrical, flight controls, hydraulic, radio navigation, flight instruments, pneumatics, etc. Principal topics will be design and testing concepts, maintainability and reliability, inspection and repair programs, and other related subjects. Emphasis will be placed on future developments in these areas.

The air carrier industry, manufacturers, general aviation industry, and others interested in this subject are invited to attend. Time will be allotted for the presentation of papers, and those attending may be asked to participate in panel discussions. The symposium will conclude at noon on the third day to accommodate travel requirements.

To facilitate arrangements for this symposium and the completion of an agenda, we would appreciate being furnished before September 15, 1967, the names of persons who plan to attend and particularly those who desire to present papers or serve on panels.
