1. PURPOSE. This circular announces the availability of Change 1, Advisory Circular (AC) 29-2A, Certification of Transport Category Rotorcraft. Change 1, dated April 24, 1989, is offered as a sale document from the Superintendent of Documents.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THE PUBLICATION. Change 1 adds 32 new paragraphs and revises 14 paragraphs. AC 29-2A consolidates Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) guidance on the certification of transport category rotorcraft. As part of the FAA effort to achieve national standardization in rotorcraft certification, it serves a ready reference for manufacturers, modifiers, FAA design evaluation engineers, flight test engineers, and engineering flight test pilots. AC 29-2A provides information on methods of compliance with Part 29 of Subchapter C, Chapter I, Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, which contains airworthiness standards for transport category rotorcraft and includes methods of compliance in the areas of basic design, ground tests, and flight tests.

3. HOW TO ORDER.

a. A copy of Change 1, AC 29-2A, may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402, or from any of the Government Printing Office bookstores located in major cities throughout the United States.

b. Identify the publication as Change 1, AC 29-2A, Certification of Transport Category Rotorcraft, Stock Number 050-007-825-2.

c. The cost of Change 1, AC 29-2A, is \$9 per copy. Send a check or money order, made payable to the Superintendent of Documents, with your request. Orders for mailing to foreign countries should include an additional 25 percent of the total price to cover handling. No c.o.d. orders are accepted.
