SUBJECT: DISTRIBUTION OF ATRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVES

- 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>. This circular announces the availability to the public of a subscription service for airworthiness directives.
- 2. CANCELIATION. Advisory Circular 39-2 dated 9/10/65 and Advisory Circular 39-4 dated 4/25/67.
- 3. DISCUSSION.
 - a. Summary of Airworthiness Directives. The new Summary of Airworthiness Directives (AD's) which includes all AD's issued through December 31, 1966, is divided into two volumes.
 - (1) Volume I Includes directives applicable to small aircraft (12,500 pounds or less maximum certificated takeoff weight).
 - (2) Volume II Includes directives applicable to large aircraft (more than 12,500 pounds maximum certificated takeoff weight).
 - b. <u>Subscription Service</u>.
 - (1) Copies of this publication may be ordered from:

- (2) Identify the publication as Summary of Airworthiness Directives, Part 39 of the FAR, and specify volumes.
- (3) Send check or money order with request, made payable to the Superintendent of Documents in the amount of \$5.25 for Volume I and \$6.00 for Volume II. Add \$1.25 for foreign mailing for each volume requested.
- (4) Supplemental service until January 1969 is included for each order.

- c. Biweekly Airworthiness Directive Cards. The biweekly AD cards which have been distributed free of charge by the FAA will be discontinued December 31, 1967.
- d. AD's to Registered Owners of Aircraft. Registered owners of aircraft will automatically receive direct from FAA only those AD's pertaining to their particular aircraft. (Also see AC 39-3).
