ANNOUNCEMENT OF AVAILABILITY

Subject: SUMMARY OF AIRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVES

- 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>. This circular announces the availability of a new Summary of Airworthiness Directives (AD), dated January 1, 1982, and provides information for ordering these publications.
- 2. CANCELLATION. Advisory Circular 39-6G, dated March 24, 1980, is canceled.

BACKGROUND.

- a. AD summaries are published in two separate volumes. Volume I relates to small aircraft of 12,500 pounds or less maximum certificated takeoff weight. Volume II relates to large aircraft of more than 12,500 pounds maximum certificated takeoff weight.
- b. ADs applicable to engines, propellers, and other aeronautical products are contained in the respective small or large aircraft volume.
- c. Each volume consists of two books. Book 1 contains ADs issued prior to 1971. These ADs will remain in effect until otherwise suspended, revoked, or amended. If an AD from Book 1 is amended, it will appear as a supplement to Book 2. Book 1 is soft bound and should be retained for future reference. Book 2 contains ADs issued during and after 1971. Book 2 is loose leaf. Biweekly supplements of the AD activity are provided for a 2-year period to update Book 2.
- d. Each book is divided into seven major subjects (aircraft, engine, propeller, equipment, instrument, radio, and general). Within each subject, ADs are listed alphabetically by the manufacturer's or type certificate (TC) holder's name.
- e. A single index covers both books. The index is prepared in two parts. The first part is a numerical listing of all ADs. The second part is a subject index listing ADs in the same sequential order in which the books are arranged. The index is updated and reissued each 6 months.

- f. AD summaries are available by subscription only. The AD subscription period is for 2 years beginning with May on each even-numbered year and ending with April, 24 months later. The current subscription period extends from May 1982 through April 1984. Subscription service begins with biweekly supplements of the current AD activity. Subscribers will receive the summary and back issues of biweekly supplements approximately 6 weeks after receiving the first biweekly issue.
- 4. HOW TO ORDER. Fill out and submit the attached form with correct remittance. If the form has been removed, submit your order as follows:
 - a. Be sure to identify the publication wanted by volume number and title.
