SUBJECT: STATEMENT OF ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTION FOR RETEST

- 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>. This circular announces a new procedure for the use of a computer printed "Statement of Additional Instruction" on each Airman Written Test Report that has an unsatisfactory grade for any section. It explains the statement and strongly recommends its use.
- 2. REFERENCES. Federal Aviation Regulations, 61.27, 63.41, 63.59 and 65.19.
- 3. INFORMATION. An applicant who fails a written test for an airman certificate or rating is normally required to wait 30 days before retesting. He may be retested sooner if he furnishes a statement from an authorized instructor certifying that he has given the applicant additional instruction and considers him ready and prepared for retesting. For the convenience of all concerned, a "Statement of Additional Instruction" will be automatically printed by the computer on each AC Form 8060-37, Airman Written Test Report, that has an unsatisfactory grade in one or more sections. This computer printed statement will contain appropriate blank spaces for the number of hours of instruction given, the instructor's printed last name and first initial, certificate number and type and signature.

Although separately prepared statements of additional instruction will continue to be accepted, the use of this computer printed statement is encouraged. An example of how the statement will appear on the test report is on page 2 of this advisory circular.

4. EXCEPTIONS. In those instances where AC Form 8060-37, Airman Written Test Report, has been lost, the printed statement will not appear on the replacement form.
