ADVISORY CIRCULAR

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION

SUBJECT: 1968 MAINTENANCE SYMPOSIUM - THE MAN IN THE MAINTENANCE RELIABILITY SYSTEM - A POSITIVE VIEW.

The Federal Aviation Administration will hold its annual maintenance symposium at the Skirvin Hotel, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on December 3, 4, and 5, 1968. This year's theme will reflect the importance of the human factors in the aircraft maintainability system. The theme selected is, "The Man in the Maintenance Reliability System - a Positive View."

It is time to hear from educators, reliability engineers, operators, foreign government officials, military officials, and others who are achieving positive results in programs to improve the utilization and advance the knowledge and skills of technicians engaged in aircraft maintenance. The air carrier industry, manufacturers, general aviation industry, training organizations, and others having an interest in this positive effort, are invited. Time will be allotted for the presentation of papers and panel discussions. The symposium will close at noon on the third day to accommodate travel requirements.

Those persons who plan to attend, and particularly those persons who desire to present papers or serve on panels, are asked to submit their names by September 15, 1968. Respondents will be notified of the final arrangements and will be supplied a copy of the agenda no later than October 18, 1968.

Representatives of the press, radio, TV, etc., are invited to cover the FAA 1968 Maintenance Symposium -- THE MAN IN THE MAINTENANCE RELIABILITY SYSTEM. An adequately equipped press room will be available for their use and convenience.

Invitations are open to any company that desires to send an exhibit to the symposium. Exhibits should be applicable to the symposium theme. Exhibits should be clearly marked for use at the FAA Maintenance Symposium and may be shipped directly to the Skirvin Hotel. The hotel will make a nominal charge of \$15 of each exhibitor for services and space. Companies desiring

to exhibit should contact the FAA, Maintenance Division, FS-300, Washington, D.C. 20590, not later than October 15, 1968.
