SUBJECT: AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER OPERATOR CERTIFICATION AND RATING

- 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>. This circular announces the availability to the public of pertinent reference material recommended in preparing for the Air Traffic Control Tower Operator Examination.
- 2. <u>PUBLICATION CANCELLED</u>. Air Traffic Control Tower Operator Examination Guide dated September 1961, is cancelled.
- REQUIREMENTS. In order to be eligible for an Air Traffic Control Tower
 Operator Certificate, a person must meet the requirements set forth in
 Federal Aviation Regulations, Part 65, Certification: Airmen Other Than
 Flight Crewmembers, Subpart B Air Traffic Control Tower Operators.
