

SUBJECT: OPERATION OF CIVIL AIRCRAFT WITH DOOR REMOVED FOR PARACHUTING, SKY DIVING, OR OTHER SPECIAL OPERATIONS

- 1. PURPOSE. This circular is to inform the public that the Federal Aviation Agency has established a procedure by which interested persons may obtain authorization for the operation of specified civil aircraft with one entrance door removed.
- 2. PROCEDURE. Persons utilizing aircraft listed in paragraph 3, and interested in obtaining authorization with appropriate operating limitations for operation of such aircraft for parachuting, sky diving, or other special operations, should forward a written request to the nearest FAA General Aviation District Office. The request must contain the following information.
  - a. Name and address of registered owner.
  - b. Make, model, and registration number of aircraft.
  - c. Place where aircraft is normally based.
  - d. Reason the aircraft is to be operated without a door.
- 3. <u>AIRCRAFT LISTING</u>.

4. OTHER AUTHORIZATIONS. Installation and removal of seats, control wheels, etc., will be handled in accordance with the applicable sections of Civil Air Regulations Part 18.
