We would be getting questions via email or from the website asking questions of everything you can imagine. Not just the data. There was three librarians that work on the hotline.

They did it for several years. At one point, the library and got a call from a reporter. He had called around to other government hotlines to get a sampling of the response time. He was blown away about what demanded. It was really fun to work on that. The variety, you can't imagine the questions we get.

As opposed to sounding they didn't quite take that time.

He wrote an article about it.

I think they wanted to downsize just because Peter felt that the government shouldn't be in the library business. I couldn't support or say is totally wrong. We had to act fast I guess. I think the lady reported at the time was afraid he was going to close down the library completely that's when we were fortunate to have a library. They didn't let me have an interest a couple of years because didn't want to raise any attention in that regard. They have the wrong agenda, and very often is to get stuff done as quickly as possible because they know they're not going to be in power forever. A lot of call data calls where they are calling for lots of information. Like how me of this or how many of that? They want it right away. It can be a very difficult time. I really think that they didn't want that big library there. There's other British traders who did not like the idea of the library either. Some of them were able to avoid any downsizing. Does that answer your question?
