#### About NTL

Established in 1998, we provide access to:

- Digital collections
- Data services
- Reference and research services
- Networking

We are an **open access** digital repository. All items are in the **public domain** and available for reuse **without restriction**.




#### NTL Mandates

- Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (1998)
  - "establish and maintain a National Transportation Library, which shall contain a collection of statistical and other information needed for transportation decision making at the Federal, State, and local levels."
- MAP-21 (2012)
  - Acquire, preserve and manage transportation information and information products and services for use by DOT, other Federal agencies, and the public
  - Central repository for DOT research results and technical publications
  - Central clearinghouse for transportation data and information of the Federal Government
  - Coordinate among and cooperate with multiple external parties to develop a "comprehensive transportation information and knowledge network"
- White House Office of Science and Technology Policy memo (2013) requiring all Executive Departments and Agencies spending more than \$100 million/year on R&D to ensure public access to peer-reviewed publications and digital datasets arising from federally-funded scientific research

#### **Collections Overview**

- Full-text digital archive for all modes of transportation and related disciplines
- 37,000 digital objects
  - Born digital objects submitted to NTL by content creators or owners
  - Reborn digital copies of physical objects, digitized at the request of NTL

# **Types of Collected Works**

- Textual works
- Still image works, including maps
- Audio works
- Moving image works
- Datasets
- Software, non-proprietary

## Accessibility

NTL follows the final Federal rule (83 FR 2912) for the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Refresh under Section 508 of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

- All public facing content submissions published on or after March 23, 2018 must be accessible
- Applies to websites, documents, and social media
- Most popular items preceding March 23, 2018 are identified and remediated for accessibility

#### Benefits of Accessible Documents

- Information is accessible to people with disabilities
- Information is findable by search engines
- Document properties boost item in search results
- Documents have provenance required for digital preservation








