REMARKS PREPARED FOR DELIVERY BY SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION JOHN A. VOLPE IN RESPONSE TO TOAST BY PRIME MINISTER RUMOR, ROME, ITALY, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 3, 1969

Mr. Prime Minister, I thank you for your gracious welcome and this delightful occasion to confer informally with you.

Transportation has played a key role in the relations between our two countries and continents ever since Columbus discovered America and Vespucci gave his name to it. The boldness and daring of those and other Italian pioneers have been an inspiration to explorers throughout the centuries.

Their achievements were, I know, in the thoughts of our own astronauts whose recent landing on the moon parallels, across the years, the achievements of Columbus in discovering new worlds. It was particularly fitting that one of the astronauts, Michael Collins, should have been born here in Rome and that all three of the moon voyagers will be visiting Italy in two weeks' time.

I consider myself particularly fortunate, as one having such close and treasured connections with Italy, to have been asked by President Nixon to make this trip. The President deeply valued the opportunity to meet with

you last February and was greatly touched by your thoughtfulness in making the journey to Washington to attend the funeral of President Eisenhower.

In the discussions I have had and will be having during this stay, I will do what I can to strengthen these bonds and, specifically, during this stay, I hope to bring some of the problems we have encountered in the transportation field closer to a solution as well as to initiate new ventures in joint research development in this field.
