(STATEMENT ABOUT MAYORS AND COUNCILMEN HAVING THE TOUGHEST JOBS IN AMERICA.)

THERE'S AN OLD SAYING: "SUCCESS IS A JOURNEY NOT A DESTINATION."

DURING THE LAST TWO YEARS AMERICA'S CITIES HAVEN'T

ARRIVED AT THE PROMISED LAND BUT TOGETHER WE HAVE BEGUN

THE JOURNEY. I DON'T SPEAK TO YOU FROM THE MOUNTAIN TOP.

LIKE YOU, MY DAY IS CAUGHT UP IN THE NUTS AND BOLTS OF

GOVERNING. YOU MIGHT SAY THAT I'M CHIEF MECHANIC AT THE

MOTOR POOL.

WHAT WE'VE ACHIEVED IN THE TRANSPORTATION AREA ARE
THEREFORE NOT GREAT THEORETICAL VICTORIES BUT SOME VERY
PRACTICAL PROGRESS.

FOR ONE THING, WE'VE STOPPED BUILDING THE KIND OF

CONCRETE CANYONS THAT GAVE URBAN FREEWAYS A BAD NAME, AND

STARTED DESIGNING HIGHWAY SYSTEMS THAT MAYORS AND COUNCILMEN

CAN SUPPORT AND BE PROUD OF. DON'T ASK ME, ASK TOM BRADLEY

OR MARGIE HANCE OR CHARLIE ROYER ABOUT THE PROGRESS WE'VE

MADE.

WE'VE ENDED WHAT I CALL THE MYOPIA OF THE TRANSPORTATION MODES. WE'VE FORCED THE FOLKS WHO BUILD HIGHWAY AND TRANSIT FACILITIES AND AIRPORTS AND RAILROADS TO START TALKING TO EACH OTHER. TO GET OUT OF THE TRENCHES WHERE THEY'VE BEEN FIGHTING AND BEGIN TO PLAN TOGETHER AS A SINGLE SYSTEM.

(EXAMPLE OF NATIONAL AIRPORT AND METRO, ETC.)

WE'RE NOT GOING TO DO THOSE KINDS OF THINGS ANYMORE.

WE'VE GOTTEN OVER THIS KICK OF PAVING OVER PERFECTLY
GOOD SYSTEMS JUST TO BUILD SOMETHING FLASHIER. YOU CAN
ASK THE MAYOR OF ST. LOUIS ABOUT THAT.

(BRING IN THE ST. LOUIS AIRPORT AND BUS SYSTEM)

WE'VE PUT TOGETHER A POWERFUL AND PERMANENT PARTNERSHIP
OUT OF THE WARRING FACTIONS (FACTIONALISM) THAT HISTORICALLY
DIVIDED HIGHWAY AND TRANSIT INTERESTS. CONGRESS PASSED AN
HISTORIC HIGHWAY/MASS TRANSIT BILL AND FOR THE FIRST TIME
EVER TREATED IT AS A SINGLE PACKAGE. THIS LEGISLATION WILL
NOT ONLY BRING TRANSPORTATION MONEY TO YOUR COMMUNITIES,
BUT IT WILL BRING COMMON SENSE.

IT WILL BRING A SINGLE PLANNING PROCESS IN WHICH YOU.

THE ELECTED OFFICIALS, WILL HAVE A LARGER SAY.

IT WILL BEGIN A SMALL URBAN AND RURAL TRANSIT LINE
THAT DOESN'T HAVE TO BEG, BORROW AND STEAL TO STAY ALIVE,
BUT LIKE THE BIG CITIES CAN NOW BE FUNDED UP TO 50 PERCENT
OF THE COST. IT WILL BRING A FEDERAL URBAN SYSTEM PROGRAM,
ONCE AVAILABLE FOR HIGHWAYS ONLY, THAT CAN BE USED WHERE
YOU NEED IT ON HIGHWAYS OR TRANSIT.

THIS LEGISLATION WILL BRING YOU NOT A ONE OR TWO YEAR
TRANSFUSION, BUT A STEADY FLEXIBLE FOUR YEAR SURFACE
TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM WHICH ALLOWS YOU TO LOOK AHEAD TO
PLAN YOUR SYSTEMS, AND TO REACT TO NEED RATHER THAN THE
SQUEAKY WHEEL.

THERE HAVE BEEN A LOT OF HEROES IN THE DEVELOPMENT

TODAY. I WANT TO APPLAUD YOU FOR WHAT YOU HAVE HELPED

BEFORE I LEAVE I WANT TO THROW OUT TWO MORE

GROUP ASSEMBLES IN LAS VEGAS A YEAR FROM TODAY.

THE COUNTRY REALLY OUGHT TO HAVE A SINGLE

TRANSPORTATION POLICY. AND LET ME TELL YOU

A SECRET, WITH MY BLESSING THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY

ADMINISTRATION AND THE URBAN MASS TRANSIT

ADMINISTRATION ARE ALREADY LIVING TOGETHER.

BUT, AS YOU KNOW, IN THE CARTER ADMINISTRATION,

THAT ISN'T GOOD ENOUGH. WE PREFER A MARRIAGE

LICENSE. SO THE PROPOSAL HAS BEEN MADE AND

BOTH SIDES HAVE ACCEPTED. NOW WE WANT THE

CONGRESS TO BLESS THIS MARRIAGE. WITH YOUR

HELP AND SUPPORT THIS CAN BE DONE.
