- Hierarchical: a term which is broader or narrower than another term
- Equivalence: synonymous terms
- Associative: related term

Basic Facts About the TRT

The TRT is a controlled vocabulary designed to improve the indexing and retrieval of transportation information. It provides a consistent language to facilitate information search and retrieval.

- Was started in 1990 at the Transportation Research Board
- Is located at https://trt.trb.org/
- Is organized into 21 facets
- Contains more than 12,000 controlled terms to use for indexing transportation information
- Contains index (subject) terms
- Is under efforts to make the TRT ISO compliant and more of semantic model

1993-96. TRT initially developed

 - Broader terms
 - Narrower terms
 - Related terms

Top Terms > Facilities > Transportation, hydraulic and utility facilities > Highway facilities > Roads > Types of roads > Principal types of roads > **Highways**

How the TRT is Used

The TRT is a controlled vocabulary designed to improve the indexing and retrieval of transportation information. It provides a consistent language to facilitate information search and retrieval.

- Is housed in PoolParty Semantic Suite
- Is used to index bibliographic information in TRID, Research in Progress database, publications index, research statements for TRB, other taxonomy projects at NASEM
- Is used for a classification tool at TRB
- Is used for selecting terms for the Technical Report Documentation Page for government research reports
- Is used to provide descriptors for analyzing and indexing documents for the National Transportation Library digital repository, ROSA-P



Aspects of Data Governance

As a controlled vocabulary, the TRT is governed by a subcommittee with established policies, procedures, roles, and responsibilities.

- TRT subcommittee is comprised of 16 members of the transportation library community.
- TRT subcommittee meets on a regular basis to consider new terms.
- The subcommittee has developed principles for the development and maintenance for the TRT.
 - The principles document is intended as a policy statement for specific practices within the organization and development of the TRT.
 - It is intended to provide scope and structure to those involved in the development of the thesaurus.



Mechanics of Data Governance

- Members collaborate using a Google site.
- Two TRB staff members research prospective terms for the subcommittee to consider.
- Members review prospective terms and make comments during a review period.
- Members attend a conference call to discuss and vote on terms.
 - Term form (e.g., plural versus singular, right concept)
 - Definition of term
 - Placement in the hierarchy
 - Synonyms (i.e., lead-in terms, non-preferred terms)
 - Related terms
- Possible outcomes:
 - Approve
 - Approve conditionally
 - Decline
 - Park



Term Research

- Two subcommittee members research the prospective terms.
- They consider the shown elements.
- This process is outlined in the *TRT*Development and Maintenance Procedures documentation.

usually from .gov sites or other authoritative resources.

LITERATURE SEARCH

-how the requested term is used in the literature. Authoritative sites that may assist in determining where to place a term in the TRT Hierarchy.
