

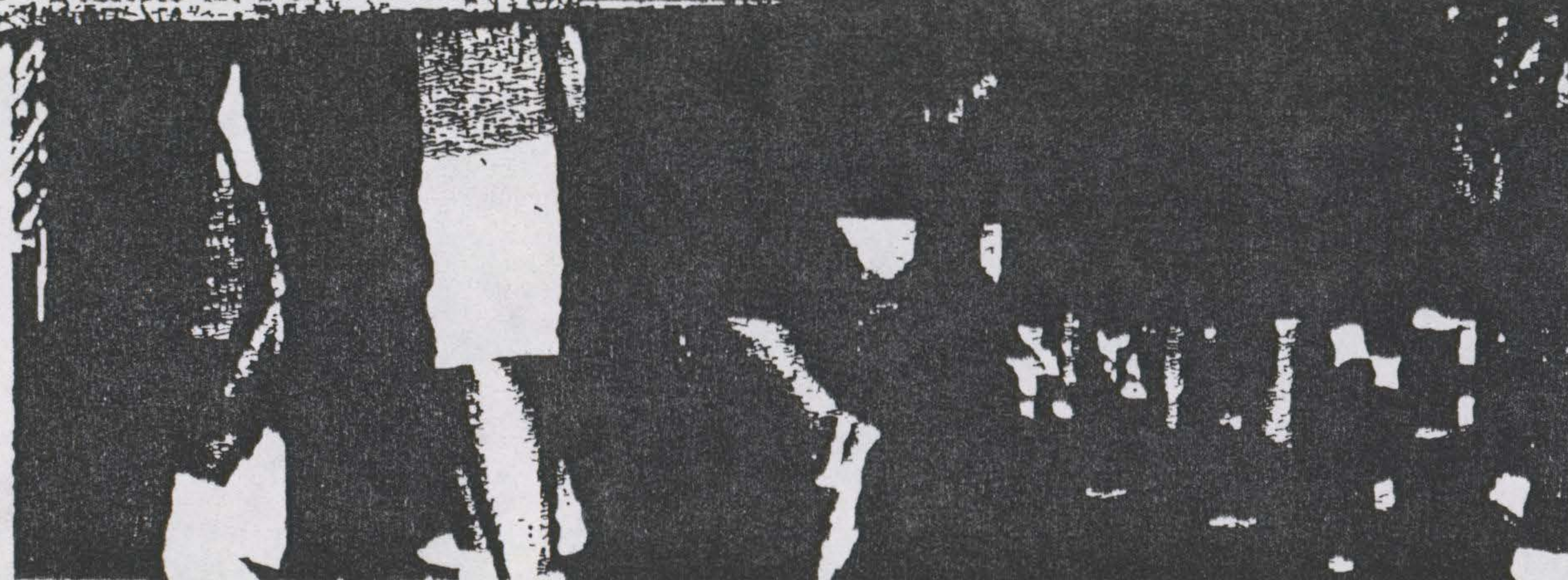

Also taking part will be Donnie Schuch and Leslie Starr Hart, superintendents of the LBJ State and National Historical Parks, respectively.

Following the wreath-laying ceremony, all bus tours will be provided free of charge from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Wednesday.

## Seniors Encouraged To Hear DA Curry At Triad Meeting

District Attorney Bruce Curry of Kerrville will be the guest speaker at the next Gillespie County Triad-SALT Council meeting scheduled here for Wednesday, Aug. 27.

Beginning at 10 a.m. in the Gillespie County Agriculture Building, 1806 North Llano, the meeting will feature observations by Curry on white collar crime as well as the work of the district attorney's office.

The local Triad-SALT (Seniors and Lawmen Together) chapter is one of 60 in Texas whose members work together to address senior citizens' concerns with regard to crime, scams and other issues.

Nationally, the organization was formed in 1988 by members of the American Association of Retired Persons, the National Sheriff's Department, and the International Chiefs of Police, explained

Administration in Austin, is also scheduled to take part.

According to Chris Bishop, an assistant public information officer for the Austin District, the dedicated garden was instigated by the Federal Highway Administration. The Texas Department of Transportation is in charge of designing and maintaining the area.

District landscape architect Kerry Blackmon designed the special area using permanent and perennial plants. Forty types of plants totaling several hundred are being planted in the area.

Included are native lantana, Texas sage, native verbena, buttercup, wild petunias, native hibiscus, mountain laurel, redbud, autumn sage, an assortment of Texas yuccas and ornamental

grasses.

The idea, Bishop said, was to go in with a variety of plants and grasses so that something is blooming in virtually every season.

Under Blackmon's direction, crews from the Gillespie County Maintenance Section of the Texas Department of Transportation are busy creating the special area. The local TxDOT will also be maintaining the flower bed.

Bishop said that the design of the dedicated area was "very challenging" because of five adverse conditions that had to be dealt with including heat, water, deer, vandalism and wind storms.

But, once complete, the area will be a "really beautiful addition to the Church Park," Bishop said.

## Child Support Program Computer Conversion Set

Texas Attorney General Dan Morales announced Friday that he is notifying utility companies across Texas of the child support program's conversion to a new federally mandated computer system.

Morales wants utility companies to extend their grace periods for affected parents. He has also notified 60,000 employers who currently garnish wages for Title IV-D child support cases.

Employers will not be affected by the conversion and should continue to forward child support payments on behalf of their employees as indicated by court order. However, all payments processed between Thursday, Aug. 28, and Friday, Sept. 5, by the Attorney General's Office will be scheduled for

delay because of the potential effect it may have on a number of your customers' ability to forward their payments to you on a timely basis. Affected parents will be furnished with correspondence they may provide you to indicate their child support may be delayed. We recognize you have the discretion to grant an extended grace period for the payment of bills by the customers who provide you a copy of Office of the Attorney General correspondence indicating they may be affected by the delay. To do this would minimize the impact of the conversion process," Morales said in the letter.

The new computer system is designed to automate manual func-

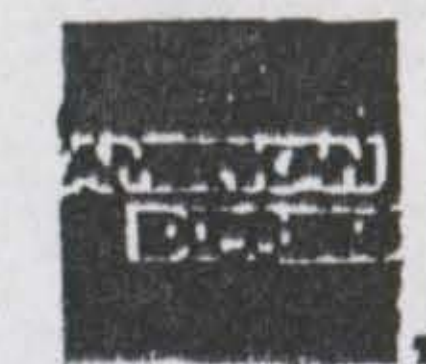

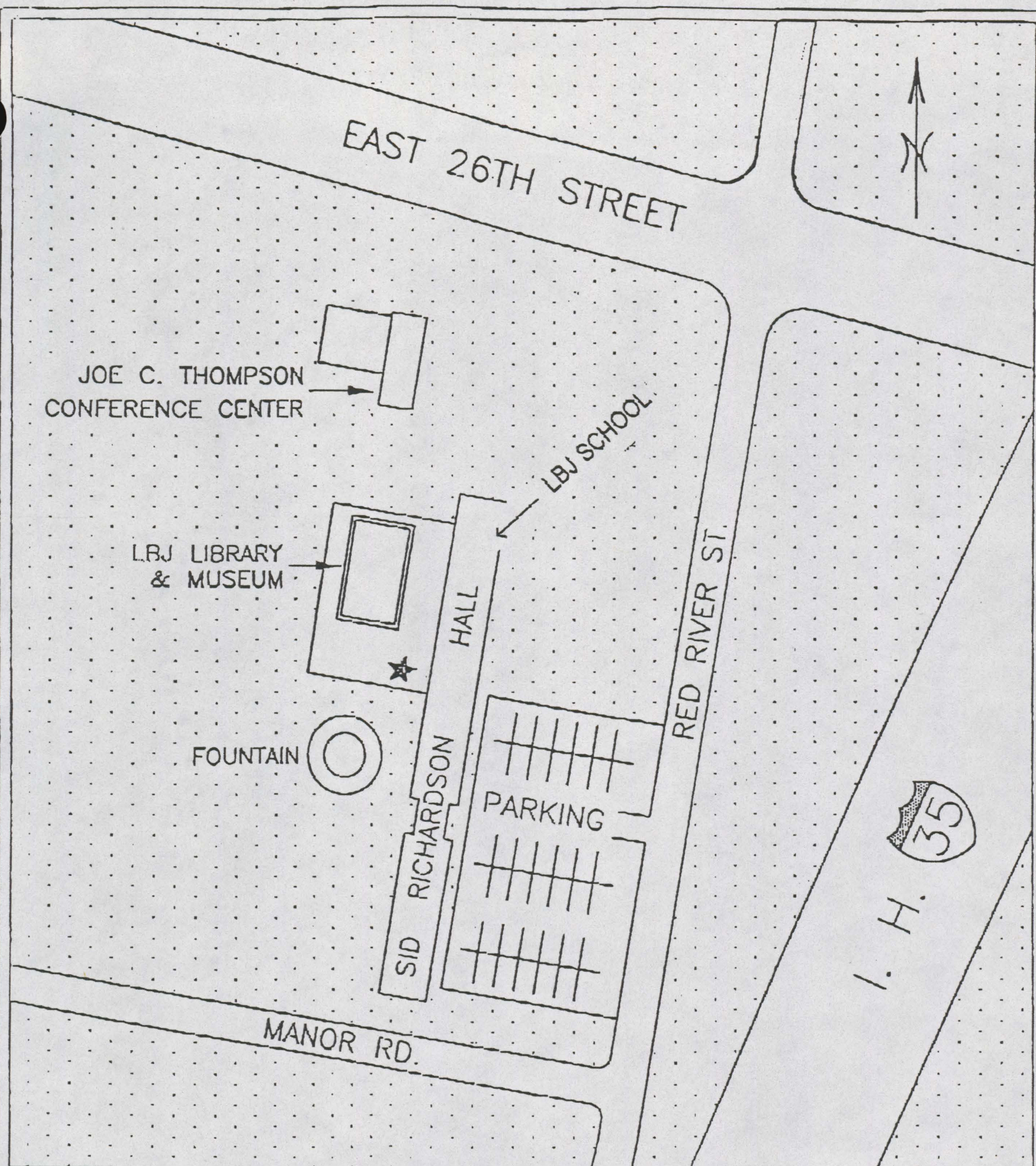
