The U.S. Department of Transportation's

Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA)

today announced a grant of \$4.24 million to the City of

Houston, Texas, to allow for the public acquisition

of the privately owned Rapid Transit Lines, Inc.

(RTL).

In making the announcement in Houston, UMTA

Administrator Frank C. Herringer said, 'it is
altogether appropriate that Houston along with
similar cities in the country, is becoming more
aware of the importance of public transportation.

We look forward to working with Houston to improve
its transit service.''

The RTL serves Houston and its surrounding communities. The system has 31 routes comprising 760 route miles. Service is provided between 5:00 a.m. and 1:00 a.m. seven days a week.

As in most parts of the country, ridership declined following World War II, and an increase in patronage was evidenced only in the latter part of 1973. Houston's program for expanded and improved transit service will make the system more accessible to all its patrons.

The UMTA grant of \$4.24 million will be matched by a local one-fifth share of approximately \$1 million by the City of Houston.
