The Department of Transportation -- in cooperation with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Department of Defense and National Science Foundation -- will conduct a symposium at Stanford University on federally-sponsored university research in transportation noise.

Secretary of Transportation Claude S. Brinegar said the intent of the symposium, to be held March 28-30, is to focus attention on noise problems being studied by universities.

"President Nixon has placed great importance on involving universities in research to answer the many complex problems we face in the field of transportation," Secretary Brinegar said.

Papers presented to the symposium by university researchers and representatives of Federal agencies will be published in book form.

Chairman of the symposium is Dr. Gordon Banerian of DOT's Office of Noise Abatement. Co-chairman is Prof. K. Karamcheti of Stanford's Department of Aeronautics and Astronautics.

Discussion topics include Jet Noise; Combustion Noise; Noise From Moving Bodies; Sound Propagation Through Ducts; Rotor Noise; High Intensity Sound; Tire Noise; Selected Problems; and Economic and Community Aspects of Noise.
