Standard time goes into effect at 2 a.m., Sunday, October 28 and clocks in most states will be turned back one hour. This will give many Americans an extra 60 minutes of sleep marking the end of daylight saving time for 1973

Since 1967, when the Uniform Time Act went into effect, standard time has been advanced one hour at 2 a.m. on the last Sunday in April and remains advanced until 2 a.m. on the last Sunday in October.

The annual ritual of turning back the clock will be ignored in Arizona, Hawaii and that part of Indiana which is in the eastern time zone -- those States that have exercised the option under the Uniform Time Act to exempt themselves from the use of advanced time.
