SUMMARY OF GRANT AND OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE URBAN MASS TRANSPORTATION ADMINISTRATION

During December 1976, the U.S. Department of Transportation's Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) announced the award of 59 grants totaling \$136,474,870.

The digest of the announced grants, including a short description of capital improvement and research projects, their dollar amount, UMTA project number and date of announcement, follows. Transit planning (technical studies), Section 5 apportioned funds for operating assistance, managerial training and university research and training grants are so noted.

Announcement of the availability of four new technical reports consisting of a compilation of current information on the problems of handicapped persons with respect to mobility.
