The U.S. Department of Transportation's Urban

Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) today announced grants totaling \$1,542,700 to 13 educational institutions. The grants are part of UMTA's University Research and Training Program and will be used to carry out research on the problems of urban transportation and to provide training for students and researchers in the urban mass transit field. By means of this program, UMTA has helped many universities establish new courses of study in urban transportation and has encouraged the development of mutually beneficial relations between the academic and transportation communities.

These grants will continue federal funding of research and training programs in the institutions listed at the level indicated.
