The U. S. Department of Transportation's Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) today announced a grant of \$862,400 to the city of Oceanside, California, to assist in the purchase of new transit equipment. Included are twenty-two 31-35 passenger air-conditioned buses, two 40-45 passenger buses, 24 registering fare boxes and 24 two-way transit mobile radio units.

The city-owned Oceanside Transportation System (OTS) presently operates a fleet of twenty-five buses over 11 routes in the North County area. It serves less than a quarter of the population. A recently completed UMTA-funded technical study identified necessary service improvements and new routes that would substantially upgrade the exsiting system. In instituting the study recommendations, the city of Ocean-side has entered into service agreements with several of the North County communities and will offer mass transit service

to a substantial portion of the county's residents.

The new buses will serve Fallbrook, San Diequito, Escondido, Carlsbad, Vista, San Marcos and Oceanside. The expanded bus fleet and improved service are expected to result in significant increases in ridership. A vigorous marketing and public information program will be implemented and maintained by OTS to attain that end.

The one-fifth share of the total project cost is being provided by local sources.
