BOSTON RECEIVES \$16 MILLION GRANT

A grant of \$16,868,565 to Boston's Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA) to help cover eligible operating expenses of the region's public transportation system was announced today by Robert E. Patricelli, Administrator of the U.S. Department of Transportation's Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA).

The Federal formula funds for operating assistance are being made available under Section 5 provisions of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964 as amended.

Patricelli said "the grant represents a Federal commitment to all modes of public transportation in the metropolitan Boston area." He commended MBTA officials on their "continuing efforts to improve service, reliability and comfort on one of the nation's most extensively used transit systems." Boston's effective use of Federal funds and annual ridership of more than 150 million patrons is solid evidence of the community's dedication to improved public transportation," he added.

Approval of the grant follows assurance by the State that State and local government support will be maintained for provision of mass transportation services on a level equal to or exceeding assistance provided for the two preceding local fiscal

years. Other requirements are to improve or continue service and to assure a charge of not more than one-half of the peak hour fare to elderly and handicapped persons during non-peak hours.
