The U.S. Department of Transportation's Urban Mass

Transportation Administration (UMTA) today announced a grant of

\$30,000,000 to the City of Philadelphia to begin construction on a

high speed rail link between downtown Philadelphia and the city's

airport. The line has been designated by the city as a Bicentennial

project and every effort will be made to complete it in time to

accommodate the large number of tourists expected during the summer

of 1976.

Presently the trip from city to airport takes 45 minutes by bus. However, the airport is expanding and traffic is increasing so that congestion around the airport is expected to steadily worsen. By 1985, airport access is projected to be extremely difficult without the rail link.

The city has considered a number of alternative access solutions including exclusive bus lanes and subway extensions. For environmental reasons as well as cost-effectiveness, a rapid-rail link was chosen for a route that would follow, as closely as possible, existing railroad rights-of-way. When completed, the 9 1/2-mile link will cut trip time to 20 minutes and offer convenient downtown transfer connections to other area transit services.

The local one-fifth share of the total project cost is being provided by the State of Pennsylsvania and the City of Philadelphia.
