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TECHNICAL NOTICE 01

This Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA) compilation of 106 urbanized areas (UZA) over 200,000 population identifies all known transit operations serving within those 106 UZAs, and indicates their relative size by number of passenger vehicles operated.

Although accurate inventories of transit service in most States are kept current by their Departments of Transportation, no national compilation has been distributed.

Such a document would be useful to UMTA personnel and to academicians, students and others recently turning their attention to the transit field. Employees of transit operations, suppliers, consultants and State DOT people also would be better informed as to the scope of the industry nationally.

However, for the present, only the 106 urbanized areas of over 200,000 are being addressed.

Column 1 ranks each UZA in the order of size, from 1 through 106.

Column 2 indicates the population of each UZA and names the transit operations serving within its borders. (Maps showing those borders appear in U.S. Census Bureau publications PC (1)-A, by States. The populations within those borders were the basis of UMTA Section 5 formula funding).

Column 3 shows the post office location of the transit operations.

Column 4 shows the number of passenger vehicles committed to transit service.

Column 5 indicates those transit operations that were listed in the 1976 American Public Transit Association directory as members. Further information is available about members from that source.

Column 6 identifies a contact person in each transit organization.

Column 7 indicates those transit carriers where operating assets are owned by private investors rather than public agencies, either in whole or in part.

On pages six through ten there is a column to indicate the existence of a transit management contract. Individual contracting firms are identified through these symbols:

ATC - American Transit Corporation of St. Louis, Missouri
ATE - ATE Management & Service Co., Inc. of Cincinnati, Ohio
CCL - City Coach Lines, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida
McD - McDonald Transit Associates, Inc. of Ft. Worth, Texas
NCM - National City Management Company of Houston, Texas

Summaries on page 10 indicate there are 440 transit operations serving the 106 largest UZAs with 14,701 rail cars and 43,908 motor coaches. To achieve a more accurate comparison of the relative size of the respective operations, on pages six through ten the numbers of vehicles shown are related to peak vehicle requirements rather than to exact physical inventories of vehicles owned.

Page 11 contains a roster of the 106 UZAs over 200,000 by States, for use as a key to locating individual UZAs by rank.

This data was compiled through questionnaires and telephone inquiries directed to individual transit operators and metropolitan planning agencies.
