The U.S. Department of Transportation's Urban Mass

Transportation Administration (UMTA) today announced the publication of a new study report entitled "Transportation for the Elderly and Handicapped."

The study explores the characteristics of transit usage by the elderly and handicapped. It identifies the major constraints on the use of mass transit systems by this group of riders and includes physical and psychological limitations, transportation costs, travel needs, information needs, and other problems.

The study is the result of case studies in 4 mediumsize geographically dispersed cities. It recommends courses of action which may be taken by transit operators to remove barriers to improved transit associated with physical, institutional, economic, information and service functions in order to improve transit services for this group of transportation disadvantaged.

The study was made by the National Urban League $\,$ of New York, under an UMTA grant.
