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PERSONALITY OF THE MONTH



The "personality of the month" is a large complex entity consisting of over 2,000,000 men and women. It is the Federal Government Civil Service which is this year celebrating its 75th Anniversary. On January 16, 1883, President Chester A. Arthur signed into law the Civil Service Act which established the principle that those persons privileged to serve the American people in Government career posts should be selected on the basis of merit.

In general, our earliest presidents made appointments to public office on a basis of qualifications. George Washington, by his insistence on ability as the prime criterion for public office, set the tone for public life for approximately forty years and established the principle that civil servants should be qualified for the jobs they hold.

As the business of government became more complex and more employees were hired, there also began to grow up a pressure for considering Federal jobs as rewards for political service. Offices were bought and sold. Payment of a year's salary for a 4-year appointment was not uncommon. Approximately a half century prior to 1883 the slogan "To the Victor belong the spoils" was the accepted principle in filling the jobs. This system reached

such proportions that in 1841, when William Henry Harrison took office as President, 30,000 to 40,000 office seekers swarmed into the capital city to claim the 23,7000 jobs that were available. By 1853 it had become the custom to stop all regular activities for a month after a change of administration to allow the President and heads of departments to devote time to settling the multitudinous and conflicting claims of the spoilsmen.

At the time President Lincoln took office in one of the greatest emergencies this country has ever known, the spoils system was running strong. But a counter-current had begun to make itself felt. Lincoln was so weary of the office-seekers who took up his time, waited outside his office, and pressed their claims as he walked down the corridors that he exclaimed, "I seem like a man so busy letting rooms at one end of the house that he has no time left to put out the fire that is blazing and destroying at the other end."

During Lincoln's first term, Carl Schurz of Missouri introduced into the Senate a bill to improve the civil service, and Representative Thomas Allen Jenckes of Rhode Island began the first of a series of studies on the civilian services of other countries. Jenckes repeatedly introduced bills for competitive examinations and nonpolitical appointments. Although his bills were defeated, he added to the total effect of the movement.

General Grant was elected on a reform platform that included a promise of

civil-service reform. Two important steps were made during his administration. First, the heads of two departments, Interior and Treasury, introduced competitive examinations administratively. Second, Grant appealed to Congress for, and obtained, a law "to govern, not the tenure, but the manner of making appointments". Grant appointed a Civil Service Commission, and in a last-minute rider to an appropriation bill \$25,000 was provided for its operation.

Although the Grant Commission went out of existence in 1875 for lack of funds, it accomplished enough to prove to the country that the merit system was both practical and beneficial. Dorman B. Eaton, one of its Commissioners, remained active and later became one of the first Commissioners under the Act of 1883.

Public sentiment for civil-service reform continued to grow, in spite of the Grant Commission setback. The climax came on July 2, 1881, when Charles Guiteau, agitated by a patronage dispute, slipped up behind President Garfield in a Washington railroad station and shot him in the back.

The tragedy aroused the American people and resulted in the passage of the Civil Service Act. The foundation work of Arthur's Commission has been strengthened by later Commissions so that the system, in its basic principles, has stood the test of 75 years and the transition of the American scene from a pioneer society to one of the most complex in the history of the world.

EDUCATIONAL SPECIALISTS REPORT TO CENTER



Arriving on board at the Aeronautical Center the last week in January were three Educational Specialists assigned to the staff of Mr. J. B. Mitchell, Assistant to the Director for Training. They are Messrs. Neil A. Fox, Robert M. Beals and Daniel W. Daughhetee.

The office of the Assistant to the Director for Training will be responsible for providing professional level educational assistance and guidance to the various training programs of the Aeronautical Center, conducting courses in instructor training, and administering CAA-wide courses in management and supervisory skills. Scheduled for early implementation is a directed study course in management for first-line supervisors, which will be administered from the Aeronautical Center on a CAA-wide basis.

Serving as a principal instructor in instructor training, Mr. Fox will perform educational consultative services in general aviation subjects. Mr. Fox comes to the Aeronautical Center from a similar position with the Naval Air Technical Training Center at Norman. He holds bachelor's and master's degrees in education and psychology from the University of Wisconsin; was a highschool teacher and superintendent of schools in Illinois from 1927 to 1942 and worked for the Veterans Administration for six years.

Mr. Beals will serve as an instructor in instructor training courses and in providing educational assistance and guidance in training involving electronics. Mr. Beals is a graduate of Northern Illinois State Teachers College, majoring in education, physics and mathematics. ...continued on page 13

BOOKSTORE OPERATED FOR CON- VENIENCE OF EMPLOYEES

Students attending the various training courses conducted at the Aeronautical Center usually have need of textbooks and a slide rule. Often the books are of such a technical nature as not to be stocked at the average bookstore and therefore difficult to obtain on short notice. To relieve this difficulty, the CAA Employees Association some years ago established a small stock of textbooks to be made available to students at a discount, operating at a margin above cost just enough to cover operating expenses. When, because of expanding activities, the Association felt it could no longer keep its capital tied up in bookstore stock, it sold the inventory to the Aeronautical Center Amateur Radio Club. The Amateur Club has been operating the bookstore for almost two years and has expanded its stock to include most of the text and reference books required by CAA students. Slide rules, too, are available. All items are sold at just slightly above cost to cover operating expenses. The margin is so small that in nearly two years the "profit" has paid back only \$100 toward the original cost of stock.

OPERATING MATERIALS DIVISION ESTABLISHED AT CENTER

Although one of the newest organizations in CAA, especially the Aeronautical Center, OMD will provide the age-old task of supply service to the operating activities with the most modern equipment and methods.

OMD was officially established at the Aeronautical Center February 24, 1957, by Administrator's Notice No. 29. Mr. Selmer R. Holte was selected to head up the new Division. Prior to his assignment at the Aeronautical Center, Mr. Holte assisted the Washington Office staff in planning and developing the new central supply activity.

The division staff will be increased as the workload progresses to approximately 102 employees. A recent increase included transfer of Aircraft Stocks & Stores Section from Property Management Branch.

Created in the interest of economy, and improved efficiency, OMD will function as one central supply service for all Continental field stations and offices. It will perform four major supply functions with respect to Operating Materials for the Federal Airways System on a centralized basis: (1) Warehousing; (2) Procurement, (3) Traffic Management

AMATEUR ROCKET LAUNCHINGS ARE OF CONCERN TO CAA

"Amateur rocketry" is becoming a new hazard to air travel, and the Civil Aeronautics Administration has warned that all proposed launchings should be discussed with its safety inspectors.

Over the country, enthusiastic young amateur scientists are proposing to launch rockets. Some of these blow up and endanger the operators, and some never get high enough to be dangerous. If however, they are launched anywhere along the airways, or in the vicinity of airports, they are the proper concern of the CAA, charged with safety in flying.

Recognizing the possible hazards involved, James T. Pyle, CAA Administrator, has warned that all proposed launchings should be discussed in advance with CAA inspectors as well as local police and fire department officials.

Still more important to the rocket launcher, the CAA points out, is his legal liability if a plane is struck by his rocket. He could be sued for damaging or even endangering a plane in flight, CAA officials believe.

Mr. Pyle made it clear that there is no attempt on the part of the CAA to either discourage or to interfere with rocket or missile experiments. The only interest of CAA in the matter is the protection and safety of the flying public.

GUY FORMAN WRITES FROM VIENTIANE, LAOS

Building houses in Vientiane, Laos without knowing the language is not as difficult as getting the right kind of haircut, writes Guy Forman, former Chief of the Supply Division at the Aero Center. Since all he can do is point, he gets an Indian haircut - a scalping. The barber, Mr. Forman insists, cuts as long as the hair lasts. Each time the hair is cut a little shorter until he expects that before too much longer haircuts will not be needed - "not because I am bald but because it will be too short to find".

Housing is a big problem but the scheduled completion of fourteen houses was to be a big step toward relieving the situation. People who have contracted to do work in Laos are often transferred in without any previous arrangements for housing. At the time Guy wrote, finding even a bed for homeless newcomers was an administrative headache. The local hotel is hardly habitable so the Formans try to find a place for another bed in their own home - when they can find the bed.

The ox cart is still the chief means of transportation, in fact the only mode of conveyance except the vehicles brought in with American aid. Jeeps Mr. Forman had ordered a year ago still had not arrived. In Vientiane there are many bicycles and motor bikes and scooters. Even the girls ride scooters.

No one in the U. S. would think of being afraid to shop at the neighborhood supermarket because of an expired identification card. Over there, expiration of a visa can be a cause for arrest and punishment. The Forman's maid who is a

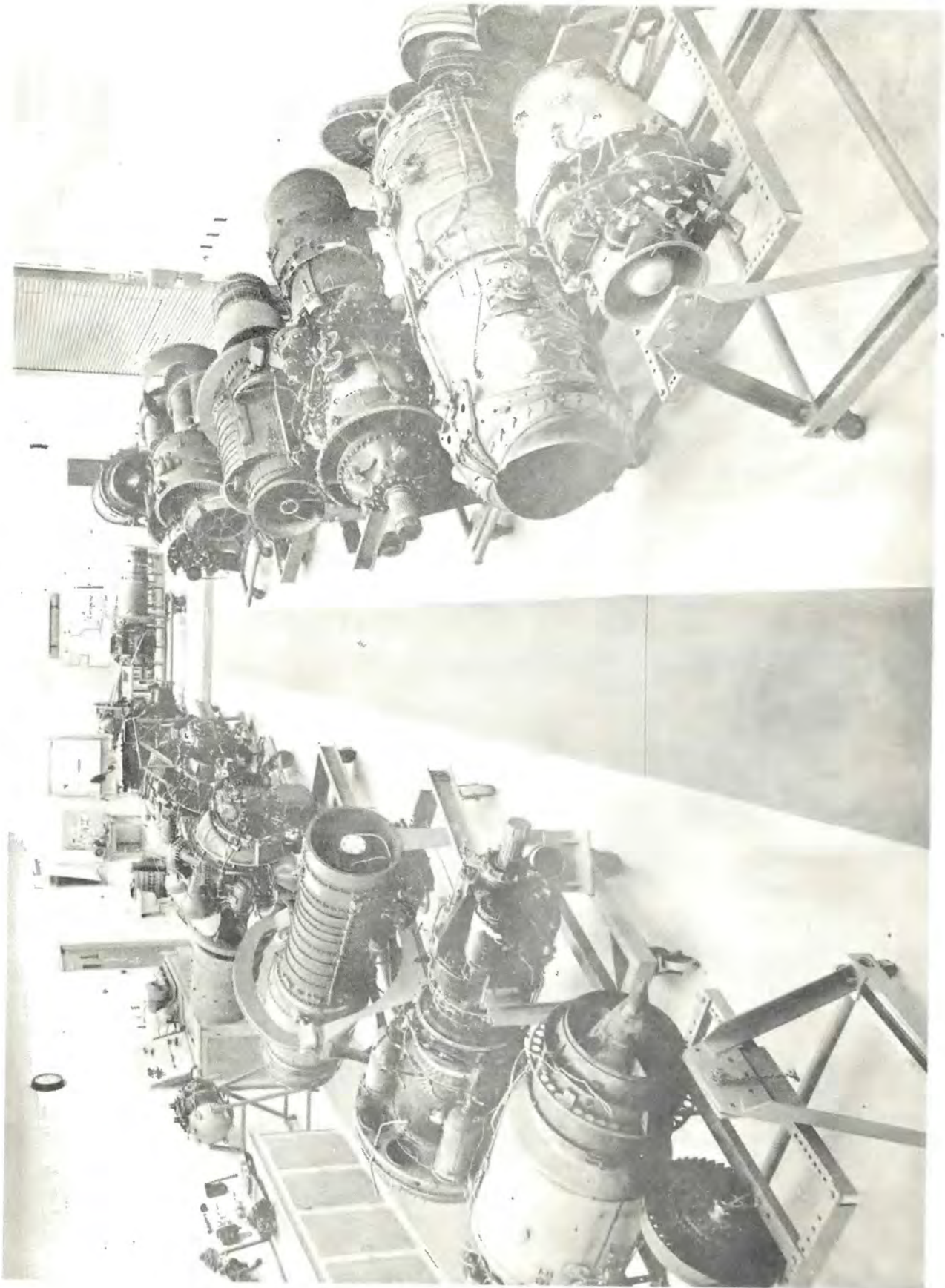
and (4) Stock Control. Electrical accounting machines will be utilized in the perpetual inventory control system.

OMD will be housed entirely in the new warehouse presently under construction. The office space will be located in airconditioned space near the Northwest section of the hugh structure.

Consolidation of the various Regional Warehouse stocks at OMD will begin immediately following completion of the new warehouse without interruption of the normal supply process. When

underway the Division will perform a tremendous volume of supply activity. Initially, the Division will provide supply support to over 5,000 various field facilities and offices located in every state in the United States as well as off-shore installations such as: Alaska, Canal Zone, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, West Indies, Hawaii and other Pacific Islands - Wake, Guam, Canton Island.

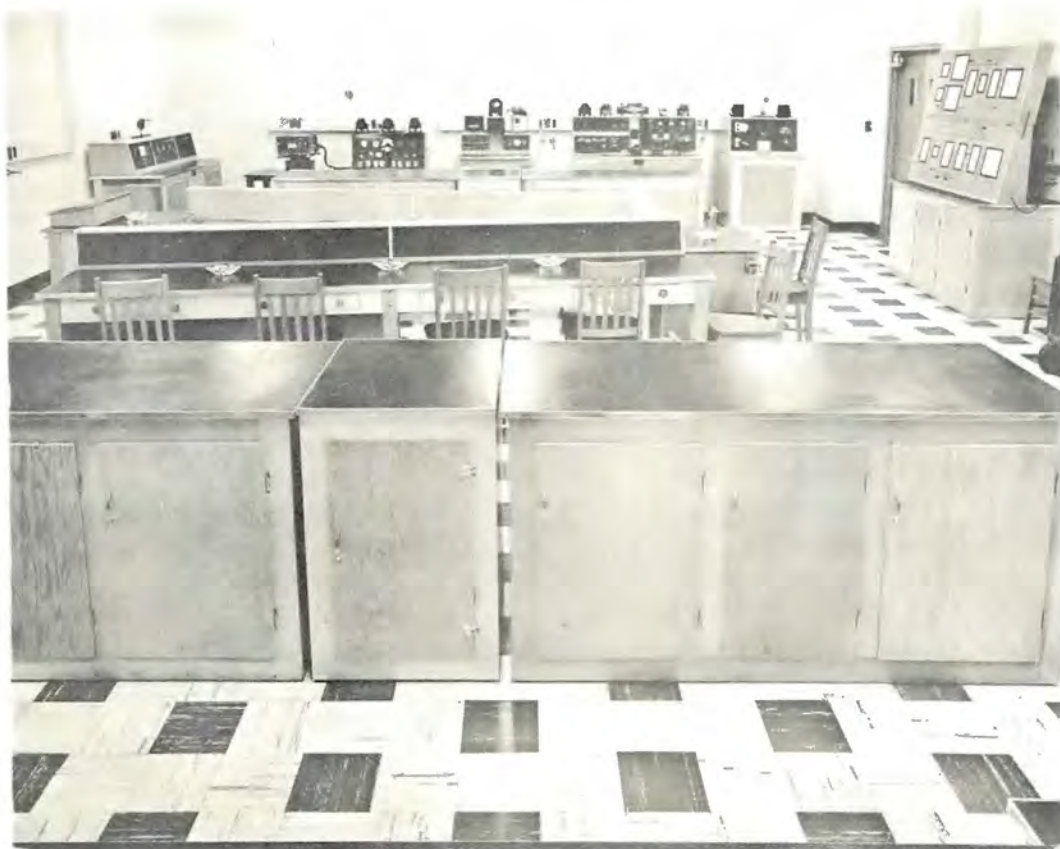

The above pictures shows the new, modern home of the model 1CA-1 Link Trainers at the Aeronautical Center. These trainers are located in the Simulated Instrument Flight Training Branch, which now has six late models of this type.

These trainers are being equipped with the following completely automatic radio aids - Dual VOR, ILS (Localizer and Glide Path), ADF and DME. Each trainer is connected to an Air Traffic Control Console via VHF Communications whereby group problems simulating any terminal areas can be practiced with complete authenticity.

These new quarters plus the new automatic aids being added to the trainers make this a Link Trainer laboratory probably unsurpassed anywhere.
