The Department of Transportation has awarded a \$140,000 grant to the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council to produce a short-range transit development program for Tampa, Sarasota and New Port Richey, Florida, Secretary of Transportation John A. Volpe announced today.

The funds, provided through the Department's Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA), will be matched by a \$70,000 local share. Previous short-range studies for Clearwater and St. Petersburg will be incorporated into the proposed area-wide study for the Tampa Bay region.

Secretary Volpe said he was particularly pleased that the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council intends to begin developing a continuous long-range transportation planning process.

"This is the type of activity we need to have if we are going to carry out President Nixon's goal of placing decision-making in the hands of those who will be affected by transportation projects," Secretary Volpe said.

UMTA Administrator Carlos C. Villarreal pointed out the study will "examine in detail the needs of the elderly and handicapped for better transit service. This area has a high proportion of elderly and retired who must rely on public transportation as a basic means of personal mobility."

Administrator Villarreal stated, "This grant is part of President Nixon's \$3.1-billion, five-year mass transportation assistance program.

"The President has called upon us to write a mass transit success story for the 1970's, and the local commitment of money and planning by the people in the Tampa Bay area proves that the American people agree with this goal," Villarreal said.
