Fares, delayed flights and reservation irregularities were the chief causes of complaints from airline passengers filed with the Civil Aeronautics Board's Office of Consumer Affairs in May, 1973.

The Office received 4,382 letters containing 6,664 complaints during the first five months of 1973. In May, consumers wrote 825 letters containing 1,181 complaints. That is a 68 per cent increase over the 703 complaints filed in 557 letters in May, 1972.

Of the complaints listed in the latest report, 108 were filed against foreign air carriers, with reservation oversales (22) as the chief cause of complaint.

The Board earlier this month proposed a rule which, if adopted, will expand the denied boarding compensation provisions of its economic regulations to encompass foreign airlines holding permits issued by the Board authorizing foreign air transportation on an individually ticketed basis.
