DOT ANNOUNCES PLANS TO AWARD \$645 MILLION IN FEDERAL TRANSIT GRANTS FOR FOURTH QUARTER OF FY 1993

Reaffirming a strong Clinton Administration commitment to improving access to public transit for millions of Americans, the Department of Transportation will award 249 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grants totaling \$645 million to 46 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, Transportation Secretary Federico Peña announced today.

The funds will be used for purposes as diverse as new vehicle acquisition, transit services for elderly and disabled persons, construction of park-n-ride facilities, and accessibility improvements such as elevator modifications, hand rails, and braille signs.

"Public transportation is essential to the quality of life for millions of people who live in cities or rural areas. Whether commuting to jobs or school, going to a doctor or purchasing groceries, public transportation is often the only means of getting people where they need to go," Secretary Peña said.

FTA Administrator Gordon Linton said, "These funds represent the Clinton Administration's pledge to helping communities across the country make important investments in our nation's public transit and transportation infrastructure."
