WASHINGTON -- The 24th annual edition of the FEDERAL EMPLOYEES ALMANAC is now available. This edition features a collection of new material of vital concern to employees of the federal government and the U.S. Postal Service.

The Almanac is compiled by Joseph Young, editor of the "Federal Column" in the Washington Star and producer of the weekly FEDERAL EMPLOYEES NEWS DIGEST which is internationally distributed.

Over the years the Almanac has become the basic reference book for federal white collar and blue collar workers and postal employees. It provides them with detailed information on their pay, job rights, insurance, retirement and other benefits.

Some of the highlights of the 1977 edition include:

- * Take-home pay tables for federal white collar and blue collar workers and postal employees, including all deductions.
- * An explanation of retirement programs including disability, optional, regular, and survivor benefits.
- * Health insurance. Full details on benefits and premiums. Life insurance. Computation tables for regular and optional insurance programs including rates for each.

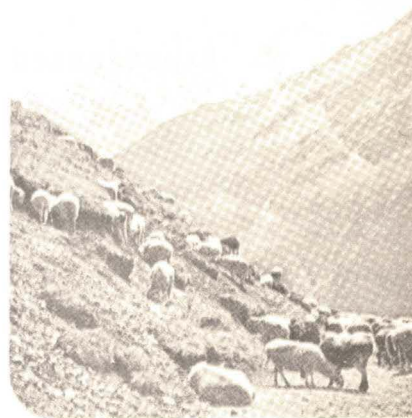

PMI, which manages the parking lot has provided us a schedule when the parking permits will be available for pick up. There is a one week grace period for obtaining your parking permit at the FA Club. After the one week grace period, we exercise our right to cancel your parking privilege as there are many people on the waiting list. If you will be on travel during the grace period, make arrangements with the FA Club Manager to hold your permit or mail it to your home.

During the open season - all employees under age 50 may obtain up to \$25,000 of coverage without having to submit evidence of good health. Once the open season closes, no employee may obtain any insurance whatsoever without submitting satisfactory evidence of insurability.
