



PARKING - FA CLUB Lot - 7th Street SW



FELIA OPEN SEASON PLANNED FOR MAY

The FELIA Group Life Insurance Plan is sponsored by the FA Club for all full time Federal employees.

During the MONTH OF MAY the Association will hold an open season for the Group Life Insurance Program.

For All Full Time Federal Employees

This plan does not replace any other insurance coverage you now have—it improves your total coverage.

FELIA Insurance Program provides voluntary supplemental term life insurance from \$8,000 to \$35,000. The premiums for the program can be paid through the convenience of payroll allotment. During the open seanson - all employees under age 50 may obtain up to \$25,000 of coverage without having to submit evidence of good health. Once the open season closes, no employee may obtain any insurance whatsoever without submitting satisfactory evidence of insurability.
