SELLOUT! SECOND PLANE CHARTERED FOR FALL TRIP TO EUROPE

All but 19 of the 144 seats on the Club's chartered jet have been sold and the Club has chartered a second plane. The early sellout of the seats on the September 11th European flight surprised everyone, including Mildred Rice, Chairman of the Travel Committee who arranged the charter and the two Motorcoach Tours. Before the Travel Committee could even distribute brochures for the Motorcoach Tours, more than 200 inquiries had been received from interested members and all but 19 seats had been sold. These 19 are all that remain of those blocked off for members who want to go on the 10-country Circle Tour of Europe. Anyone planning to take this tour had better send in the \$209.00 now to be sure of getting a seat.

Four extra days

The chartered second plane is a Sabena DC-7. The round trip fare is \$220 inclusive, same as the first chartered plane. The flight, however, will be from the Baltimore Friendship airport to Brussels, leaving here Sunday, Sept. 9th, and returning to Friendship from Brussels Saturday, October 13th. This allows those traveling on this plane 4 extra days in Europe. Early registration is important. Ap-

proximately 20 passengers are already booked on the second plane; seats are being sold on a first-come first served basis. No seats will be blocked off for motorcoach tour members. A \$220 payment per passenger is required. If you find it necessary to cancel after making the payment, you may do so up to August 9 and full refund will be made. After that date refund will be made if a qualified replacement is available.

The Good Old Days

Smatterings of FA Club History

For the benefit of the late FA comers, we made a musty trip back through the files the other day, with the idea of bringing the history of the FA Club up to date. In 1950, the then Managing Editor of the Civil Aeronautics Club News, Fred A. Toombs, wrote the history of the Club to that date, and most of the following was culled from that version. The venerable ancestor of the FA Club entered the world on April 19, 1939, under the name of the Civil Aeronautics Authority Club. At close of its first year of organization the CAA Club boasted 248 members. The nadir was reached only a little more than two years later, when the figure dropped to 71 in September 1941. This was at the time of one of the drastic reorganization plans that have affected the Agency under its various names; in this one, the old Civil Aeronautics Authority became the Civil Aeronautics Administration and the Civil Aeronautics Board. The CAA Club continued with the membership and support of both Agencies. Right after Pearl Harbor that year, the intrepid Board of Directors went right ahead and changed the name to the Civil Aeronautics Club. Membership shot back to 222 by the end of that year, and remained in the 200-300 bracket for a few years afterward.
