METROLINER TICKETING FACILITY IN DOT HEADQUARTERS BUILDING

A Penn Central Company Metroliner reservation and ticketing facility went into operation on July 16, 1970, as part of our DOT Travel Services. A formal opening of the facility is planned for the near future but the services are now available to travel services organizations in other Government agencies and to the public. The facility is located in Room 5402 of the Headquarters Building and its hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

AIR-CONDITIONING/HEAT IN NASSIF BUILDING FOR NON-DUTY HOURS

In Southwest Seventh issue No. 11, we pointed out that requests for week-end air-conditioning or heating service in the DOT Headquarters Building had to be submitted by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesdays. Since that time, we have negotiated with Nassif Associates for a shorter lead-time requirement on their part. It is now possible for the Office Services Division (TAD-47) to accept properly approved requests up to 10:00 a.m. Fridays for week-end service. Requests received after that time on

Friday, or made to the Office of Administrative Operations Duty Officer (Room 2318E, ext. 62458) before noon on Saturdays, will be handled on an emergency basis. Because the reprogramming of the automated time control on the equipment is a lengthly procedure, only a limited number of emergency requests can be met.
